During the month(s) of June / July of 2023 in Rosewell there were 95 calls made to Police.

Incidents of Note

On Wednesday the 7th of June 2023, at Thornton Farm, two quad bikes were on the field next to Thornton Farm, when they had not been given permission to be there. Police attended the area, however, the quad bikes had since left the area.

On Friday the 11th of June 2023, at the bus stop opposite Fairlie Gorve, multiple youths were shouting and banging on the side of the bus stop. Police attended the area, however, the youths were not traced. Similar calls were received regarding youths at the bus stop on Carnethie Street on Friday the 16th of June, however, due to numerous high graded incidents, officer could not attend until later that evening, when all youths had left the area.

At 2030 hours on Monday the 3rd of July 2023, at Rosewell Convenience store, Preston hall Road, 4 youths have been outside the shop shouting and throwing stones. Police attended a short time later, however, the youths had left prior to Police arrival. No damage was caused to the store.
