3.1	Lothian Buses - Rosewell is viewed as a Community of elderly residents who	Lothian	
	commute to nearby villages and towns and do not go into Edinburgh	Buses /

	Lothian Buses – have been concentrating on routes to other villages		
	(historical), but are happy to review.		
	Lothian Buses - Midlothian Council used to support bus service, but Rosewell		
	is now a wholly commercial service and is running at a loss on the Rosewell		
	part of the journey.		
	Lothian Buses - were initially given funding from the Scottish Government, but this is no longer the case. Services operate at a loss in Midlothian area but LB		
	need to cover costs		
	Lothian Buses – bus corridors are becoming busier, which results in buses		
	taking longer – this impacts on running costs. City of Edinburgh Council are		
	presently working on congestion problems to help lessen bus journey times.		
	Resident – only one bus goes through the Park and ride which is not taking in		
	the bigger picture of getting into Edinburgh.		
	Lothian Buses – have not seen an increase in commuters from new		
	developments.		

	Resident – with the substantial increase in development Lothian Buses should	
	put buses on for people to get used to them.	
	Residents - driving to Bonnyrigg for 31 bus.	
	Lothian Buses - decriminalisation of parking might stop people from using cars. Resident - Could 31 buses come to Rosewell?	
	Lothian Buses - If 31 was extended to terminate at Rosewell, it would result in	
	'Rosewell being over-bussed' and could be at the expense of losing the 49.	
	Resident - Could every alternate 31 buses come to Rosewell?	
	Lothian Buses - don't like complex journeys	
	Resident - 2 nd bus stop in Carnethie Street not sheltering people –this is	
	Midlothian Council's remit.	
	Resident - could minibuses or smaller buses be used?	
	Lothian Buses – have no minibuses which could be used, but could look at this	
	for longer term solution.	
	Resident - could 49 timetables be changed to co-ordinate with 31	
	Lothian Buses - will look at this.	
	Resident – Sunday, weekends and late nights can take 2 hours to get to work.	
	Resident – I have to stay half of the week with relatives in Penicuik to enable my commute to work in Edinburgh	
	Resident – I cycle elsewhere to catch bus.	
	Lothian Buses - reviewing Sunday service, but cannot run empty buses	
	Lothian Buses – an extra X31 has been added (10-minute service), but this has	
	been due to passengers further along the route	
3.2	A resident raised concerns about cars/vans parking in bus stops making it	Midlothian
	difficult/impossible for buses to get in to the bus stop.	Council
	Karl Vanters informed the meeting that Midlothian was currently going through	
	the process of introducing decriminalization of parking and, at the time of the	
	meeting, this was expected to go "live" in April 2018. Once active, this allows	
	matters such as parking at bus stops to be tackled by Council-appointed	
	wardens and, in a small way, will contribute to reducing delays to the buses. It will also benefit those travelling by bus in a wheelchair, using a walking aid or	
	pushing a buggy as the bus will be able to pull into the kerb if other vehicles are	
	no longer obstructing the way.
