Recycling Centres

Entry to recycling centres is still by appointment only

To visit a recycling centre in the Vale of Glamorgan, you will need to book an appointment online.

Any residents visiting one of our recycling centres must comply with the current Government guidance and adhere to the social distancing measures that are in place, this is to ensure safe operation and use of the recycling centres.

Please note: We are unable to provide assistance with lifting or sorting, so please ensure all waste and recycling is manageable.

The following is in place:

- One appointment per household, per 30 day period.
- Only cars are permitted access. Unfortunately, we are unable to provide access or appointments for trailers or vans at this time.
- Before visiting, residents must sort their waste or recycling appropriately to minimise the time at the site.
- Residents must display their confirmation email and proof of residency e.g. driving licence or utility bill, in their windscreen whilst waiting to enter the site.
- Residents must follow on-site safety signs and guidance.
- Residents should only exit their car when advised to do so by a member of site staff.

Appointments for the period 8 - 21 July are now available to book for Barry and Llandow Recycling Centres.

- Distribution the green food waste bags continues - these can now be accessed from the local library service
- Ewenny / Corntown Electoral Commission Draft proposal – consultation extended until September 2020.
- Ewenny/Corntown community engagement – centre of excellence for sport – ongoing

- Sunflower project The Big Sunflower Project is an initiative of [The Information Point for Centronuclear and Myotubular Myopathy](https://centronuclear.org.uk/2020/01/09/the-big-sunflower-project-2020/?fbclid=IwAR3mEr3eccGXYKi72Z_0PkVC9onTiQPm2NCYFALpDosrtB98UxFGGGTvjdk) which aims to provide information about and raise awareness of these rare neuromuscular conditions. The project raises awareness by sending sunflower seeds to people who have never heard of centronuclear and myotubular myopathy and by sharing participants photos online. 2020 is the tenth year of the project and this year 300 packets of seeds containing 50 seeds will be distributed in 2020 (one packet of seeds per applicant.)
