"Celebrating 150 Years of the Highland Main Line: an Exhibition Prepared by High Life Highland"

Tuesday 4th June – Saturday 29th June, Room to Discover, Inverness Museum and Art Gallery

This exhibition of objects, images and archive materials from the High Life Highland collections, celebrates the 150th anniversary of the opening of the Highland Main Line, originally named the Inverness & Perth Junction Railway.

The making of the railway was a considerable engineering achievement, including rising up and through the Dromochtar Pass, at 452 metres the highest point on any main line in Britain.

On 1 June 1863 the first section of the line was opened from Dunkeld to Pitlochry, on 3 August the Forres-Aviemore section followed and on 9 September the Aviemore-Pitlochry section was completed, completing the main line across the Grampians.

'I'm a Piece': Saving children's lives through craft!

This exhibition showcases jigsaw pieces made by craft lovers across the UK as part of the #imapiece project. The project was launched on World Food day last October by Save the Children to raise awareness of the issues of world hunger and injustice and show that the craft community wants the Government to push world leaders to invest in life-saving interventions that will save millions of lives. Since the launch over 700 people have added their hand-stitched jigsaw pieces with their messages on why tackling hunger and malnutrition is so important to them.

The project is part of a growing craftivism – or craft activism – movement that aims to tackle poverty and injustice through thoughtful, visually beautiful campaigning.
