Three Lessons to Learn for 2021 by Nigel Wren

A few weeks before the first lock-down started in March 2020 I heard Anthony Brett give a five minute talk on the teachable mind-set that should mark us as Christians. I just summarise the points Anthony made and feel that if we apply in our lives what the Lord teaches us we will be blest in 2021.

So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom. These words in Psalm 90:12 encourage us to reflect on the brevity of life, not to make us morbid or depressed, but to enable us to focus on the eternal realities which the believer has in Christ.

Now Jesus was praying in a certain place, and when he finished, one of his disciples said to him, "Lord, teach us to pray, as John taught his disciples." Luke 11:1.

As we consider the different aspects of prayer in this prayer that the Lord taught His disciples –worship, requests and confession-we are reminded of the central place prayer has in the life of the Christian

Teach me your way, O LORD, and lead me on a level path because of my enemies. Psalm 27:11

The Psalmist is surrounded by those who were opposed to him and he recognises that he needs guidance and direction from the Lord so as to live to please God in a hostile environment.
