Many years ago I worked in motor insurance underwriting. The basic principle was to charge a premium appropriate to the level of risk insured. So being the only driver, garaging the car and a limited mileage would reduce risk whereas a high performance vehicle, a past conviction or a young driver would increase the risk and consequently the premium.
