Section B – PREMIER SECTION

Our Premier Section is for exhibits of the highest standards of quality and presentation.

Exhibitors in the Premier Section may enter only one exhibit per class. Exhibitors in Classes B3 and B12 may not enter the equivalent Classes A19 and C1.

McTavish Cup for Best Exhibit in Premier Section

Each Exhibit will be judged on Quality 20 points, Content 20 points, Presentation 10 points.
The McTavish Cup will be awarded to the exhibit with the highest total points.

- B2. Exhibition Onions – 3 Onions from Seed, each over 250 grams

- B4. Trio of Onions – 3 Onions under 250grams from Seed, 3 Red Onions,

(Manner of presentation at exhibitor's discretion)
- B5. Premier Tray – Collection of four kinds of home-grown Vegetables
taken from the following list and displayed within a tray or dark cloth
no larger than 75cm x 60cm, to be judged in accordance with Rule 11.
Runner Beans (6), Peas (6), Onions (2), Cauliflowers (1), Leeks (2)
Stump Carrots (3), Parsnips (2), Potatoes (3), Tomatoes (4).
All varieties to be named. (Backboard allowed within tray/cloth dimensions)
- B10. Sweet Peas – 3 vases, 3 named cultivars, 9 blooms of one cultivar per vase
- B11. Dahlias – 3 vases, 3 named cultivars, 3 blooms of one cultivar per vase
- B12. Premier Vase – a total of no more than 12 mixed flowering stems/flower

in proportion but not assessed. Display will be judged from all round.)

RULES

1. Exhibitors may enter 2 exhibits in each Class in all Sections except Sections B and L and may be awarded 2 prizes. Only the highest prize will count towards points for trophies. Where two or more Exhibitors have the same number of points, the trophy will be awarded to the Exhibitor with the most 1st prizes. Exhibitors may enter only one exhibit in each Class in Sections B (Premier) and L (Novelty Veg). Points will be awarded in all Classes except those in Sections B and L: 1st 5 points; 2nd 3 points; 3rd 1 point, but in Classes A32 and E3 points will be 1st 12 points; 2nd 8 points; 3rd 4 points.
2. Exhibits are to be displayed on plates, boards, cloths, or trays as and where appropriate and these are to be supplied by the Exhibitor. Exhibits in Section C are to be staged in vases supplied by the Club.
3. ALL EXHIBITORS ARE HELD TO DECLARE THAT THEIR HORTICULTURAL EXHIBITS HAVE BEEN GROWN BY THEM FOR AT LEAST SIX WEEKS AND IN ALL OTHER SECTIONS THAT EXHIBITS ARE THEIR OWN WORK. Exhibits shown in any previous Lhanbryde Flower Show may NOT be exhibited in this flower show.
4. ENTRIES FROM NOVICES (FIRST TIME EXHIBITORS) SHOULD HAVE A LARGE X MARKED ON THE OUTSIDE OF THEIR ENTRY ENVELOPES in order that their exhibits may be considered for the award for Best Novice in Section.
5. Only Exhibitors, Stewards and Committee Members are allowed in the Hall during the staging of Exhibits. Only Officials are allowed in the Hall during judging.
6. The Secretary will record the Judges' decisions, which will be final. The record will be the official prize list.
7. For purposes of the Show a local resident shall be any person residing within the Parish of Lhanbryd and Urquhart.
8. Exhibits must not be uplifted until 4.00pm. **Note that**, with the exception of exhibits in Sections B, E, and K, any exhibits that remain after 4.30pm will become the property of Lhanbryde & District Gardening Club.
9. The Committee will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to any article while under their charge; at the same time every care will be exercised to prevent anything of the kind taking place.
10. Class A43 Box of Vegetables is to be a minimum of four kinds (not varieties) of vegetables in any number of each shown WITHIN a box or basket not exceeding 60cm x 45cm.
This Class is to encourage the exhibition of a range of kitchen vegetables and so the produce should be clean, appetising, and ready for use in the kitchen, and the judge will look for variety, quality, cleanliness, and freshness of produce - ie the contents should look tempting, tasty, and good enough to take straight to the kitchen. Prizes for Class A43 will be awarded on the overall basis of Quality 20 points, Content 20 points, and Presentation 10 points.
11. Class B5 will be judged for the Class prizes on a points system - runner beans, onions, carrots, tomatoes 18 points and peas, cauliflowers, leeks, parsnips, potatoes 20 points.
