5. Retrospective concrete alterations to runway, matting, drainage, Bagby Airfield 21/01243/FUL
6. Rear extension, Lilac Cottage, Vicar Lane, Little Thirkleby 21/01369/FUL

21/19 FOOTPATH IMPROVEMENTS

It was proposed that various footpaths and bridges over Thirkleby Beck could be improved to form a safe circular route connecting Great and Little Thirkleby. Cllr Beth Barber-Atkinson to approach land owners to explore the viability.

21/20 ROAD SAFETY CAMPAIGN

A recent road traffic collision on Low Lane / Back Lane and witnessed by Cllr Beth Barber-Atkinson has highlighted the need for traffic calming / signage / reduced speed limits. A dedicated email address, backed up with a door to door leaflet drop will be set up in order to gather evidence for safety improvements.

21/21 FINANCIAL MATTERS.

The current financial position was discussed:

1. The main expenses have been grass cutting and more recently hall hire.
2. The precept for 2021/2022 had been set at zero to reduce the bank balance.
3. The bank balance at 1st August 2021 was £7372.25.
4. The budget/financial forecast for 2021/22 was studied and approved.
5. The bank mandate was updated with new signatories.


