Minutes Tuesday 9th August 2016

Jimmy Yule, Chairman, opened the meeting by welcoming all.

Police Report:

Attended by PC Fiona Cunningham CBO - the police report compiled from 7/6/16 to 9/8/16 - 557 calls were made to police from the Prestonpans area, resulting in 115 crimes being recorded of which 49 have been solved. Enquiries are on-going into the unsolved crimes. PC Cunningham stated that there has been an increase in complaints re youths and antisocial behaviour, community officers have been focusing on these issues during the summer and have been working in conjunction with other agencies.

Other crimes listed:- Housebreakings/thefts from garden sheds/substance misuse/violence/vandalism/vehicle windows smashed.

Minutes Amendment from 14/6/16 – Power Station Land

Page 3 – paragraph 4 – line 5 – Calum stated that he wished the minutes to be changed from "that his comments has been misinterpreted in the publication" – to "his comments were open to interpretation"

<u>Update on Power Station Land – Sub Group</u>

The sub group held a meeting on 22/7/16 and Calum also attended a meeting of the Cockenzie Forum. Calum gave an overview of both meetings. It was noted that the asbestos pipeline was not included in the masterplan. PCC unanimously agreed the masterplan provided that the pipeline is included. Block 6 + 9 - type of industry required - all were in favour of supporting the Scottish Automation Centre.

Update on Bank Closure

RBS closed on 9/8/16 – Mr Innes states that ELC had arranged a meeting with RBS to ask for a stay of execution, however RBS changed the original meeting date to the 17/8/16, by this time the bank had been closed.

Treasurer's Report

Ferhan advised the balance on the following accounts:-

RBS as at 9/8/16 is £4,549.29 and all accounts have been paid and all cheques cleared. ELC account balance is £9,690.78 (uncommitted).

<u>Funding:</u> 1. PYCP – training fund for volunteers £500. 2. East Lothian Food initiative charity - providing plants/seeds, wind damage to greenhouse for Prestonpans & St Gabriels school gardens £350.

Both amounts agreed by all.
