## **SSEN Spittal to Beauly Line**

The Community Council Forum, headed by Ron McAulay at Strathpeffer, has circulated a number of letters, for amendment and comment, which they plan to send to SSEN, OFGEM, the National Grid and the First Minister, if there is agreement. The CommunitiesB4PowerCompanies Group subsequently circulated an e-mail suggesting the community councils should not agree to the draft letters on the basis the CCs should not engage and could incur financial penalties if they ask SSEN to consider investigating an alternative to their current proposals. The community council will continue to engage with the Forum to consider the letters and potentially seek amendments.

#### **Fountain**

Pump to be tested before setting fountain up for this year. We will ask Electrician to check out pump

### Station Road Hedges/gardens

Emma to contact Lyndale to remove hedge at entrance to Braeview park and to cut trees at back of garden which are covering Electric charging points. Emma also going to enquire about responsibility of council tenants/ private owners maintenance of gardens as a large number throughout the village require attention.

### 20mph Zone

Still awaiting Bollards and Dragons Teeth. Dropped kerb at Gift still to be completed. Cables in place through out village for speed survey. Report on the vibration and noise survey over a 24 hour period still to be received.

### Water on Beauly Straight

Helen Crawford has reported water lying on Beauly Straight and the choked culverts and has been advised that they will be looked at.

#### **CNOC**

First cut of path has been completed by Lovat Estate and Simpsons Builders have agreed to do second cut in July. Path works have been completed including new hard core in the station road section.
