Teresa of Avila

In October of this year the Church will declare a **Year of Faith** in and through which people will be encouraged to penetrate the richness of their Christian heritage in a more personal and reflective manner. Similarly, my own Religious Order is tentatively making plans to petition the Pope to declare **2015 a Year of Prayer**. This will coincide with the Celebration of the **5**th **Centenary of St Teresa of Avila's birth**.

As an Order, we wish to mark this event because Teresa, a Doctor of the Church, remains our constant inspiration and guide to identifying our role within the Church and the world. Her message needs to be shared because, as Doctor of the Church, her message was proclaimed accessible to all. This was a declared title in recognition of Teresa's personal encounter with prayer. The Church understood she had insights to the interior life that were unique yet profoundly helpful in assisting anyone serious about developing a prayer life. Teresa's influence over the Church lies in her charism of prayer which remains tied to friendship with Christ that even today remains a source of renewal for anyone who desires to discover the reality of God in their lives.

Here is an example of her initial insights to an essential characteristic in any prayer life:-

Since vocal prayer is prayer, it must be accompanied by reflection. A prayer in which a person is not aware of whom he is speaking to, what he is asking, who it is who is asking and of whom, I do not call prayer, however much the lips move. Sometimes it will be so without this reflection, provided that the soul has these reflections at other times. Nonetheless, anyone who has the *habit* of speaking before God's majesty as though he were speaking to a slave, without being careful to see how he is speaking, but saying whatever comes to his head and whatever he has learned from saying at other times, in my opinion is not praying. Please God, may no Christian pray in this way. (Interior Castle 1:1)

So many of us are trying to etch out little moments throughout the day to hear God; on the tube people reading little bibles; apps with spiritual reading from spiritual guides like Teresa; with the intent to ponder what's being read, listened to, yet amid so much distractions of people going about their business, perhaps we do not have the chance to reflect there and then. Teresa would say that is OK but do not forget to find the time later on to catch up! Mary pondered in her heart all that was being said and done to her. She reflected – let's not forget about this other side of prayer when next we move our lips fast or slow!
