Third Sunday of Advent: Gospel: John 1:6-8,19-28

The **Prophet Isaiah** announces glad tidings to the dispirited and brokenhearted. God who is mighty does great things for us! God frees all those bound in physical, emotional and mental prisons. God is a faithful bridegroom who has not forgotten his beloved bride. God is a gardener who makes justice spring forth from the barren ground.
