The Bread of Life

At every Mass the Priest says the following prayer when the bread is offered: Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation. Through your goodness we have this bread to offer, which earth has given and human hands have made. It will become for us the <u>bread of life</u>.

This is the mystery of the Eucharist. Wheat, grown in the earth, made into bread by human beings, becomes the bread or food or sustenance of life itself. Jesus tells us in today's Gospel: "I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh for the life of the world".

This bread we hold in our hands, place on our tongues and swallow like all other food. This bread nourishes us both physically and spiritually, it is food for this world and for eternal life. We cannot live without food and here we have the food that enables us to live forever. Furthermore, this same bread is the body of Jesus Christ. Jesus himself is our food, we are nourished by Him, He feeds us with Himself. What Jesus does for us in the Eucharist He does both physically and spiritually. He gave his body to us on the cross, he asked us at the last supper to take, eat, drink of the bread and wine which is His body and blood.

Jesus is not just present in our world spiritually, He is also, and very importantly, present physically. We can touch, hold and eat Him, we can pray before Him present in the tabernacle of our Churches and we can pray and meditate on His presence deep within us which is nourished by frequently receiving Him in the Eucharist.

St John begins his Gospel by telling us that all life has come through Jesus and Jesus is the life of the world. That life now becomes flesh and makes His home among us. That is what we celebrate today: God who has made

BCL easyPDF Printer Driver His home with us, God lives with us and by living with us and in us, he enables us to live fully and forever. There are only two things for us to do when faced with such a profound mystery: **Receive** and **Give Thanks.** Jesus is giving us Himself, let us be open to receiving all He is saying, giving and doing. All the Eucharistic Prayers remind us that Jesus gave thanks at the last supper. When we are present at this, the greatest of all meals, let us open our hearts and minds in thanks and praise. The day before He suffered He took bread in his sacred hands and looking up to heaven, to you, his almighty Father, He gave you thanks and praise. (Eucharistic Prayer No. 1)
