The Mission of Jesus

Jesus calls disciples and educates them so that they may be ready to take over his mission when he is gone. That is what is happening in our Gospel today. Let us take note of three aspects of this mission:-

Understanding: When Jesus <u>saw</u> the crowds he <u>felt</u> sorry for them because they were harassed and dejected, like sheep without a shepherd.

Jesus understood this crowd, their pain, problems, struggles and indeed every aspect of their lives. The people are open to listening to Jesus because they know they are listening to someone who understands them.

The Church's mission begins by listening to the needs of people and showing by words and actions that it understands.

Prayer: <u>Ask</u> the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to <u>His</u> harvest.

The work of the Church is God's work, not its own work. There can be no mission without prayer. Whoever speaks in the name of Jesus must be in constant communication with the Father. The Church's first mission is to be a link between God and humanity [we see Moses playing this role in our first reading today]. The mission is always the fruits of the Church's prayer. Any work done that is not rooted in prayer is merely a human endeavour and not the work of God – in other words it is no longer <u>His</u> harvest.

Activity: Go to the lost sheep of the House of Israel, and as you go, proclaim that the Kingdom of God is close at hand. Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse the lepers, cast out devils.

The disciples must go to where Jesus sends them and do what he says. We note he is only sending them to the people of Israel, the time has not yet come for them to go to the Samaritans and pagans – that will come later. The work must be done as God wants it to be done and in God's time.

In this Gospel the activities that the disciples are asked to do are the same activities as those of Jesus. The work began in the life of Jesus continues in the work of his disciples and the Church.
