#### The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is a process of accompaniment to bring a person discerning God's call into communion with the body of Christ – the Church. What she believes and teaches about God, Jesus and kingdom are explored in ways that trigger thought. Food to help understand the movement of God's spirit within a person, and strengthen faith in this mystery revealed within the life of the Church.

Within our parish we have six people walking this path at present. Recently the mystery 'always ancient, always new' – Jesus as 'true God and true man' was pondered. Essentially, because this would have been in the mind of most people, as Christmas, Epiphany, as well as Baptism, were feasts liturgically celebrated.

Wrestling with this fundamental truth, encouraged all to reflect on the sacramental implications. Suppose Jesus was only man and not at the same time the son of God? Would that have any relevance? We wrestled between it being unimportant to it being essential; from Jesus manifesting a moral code as another type of good person, to Him being unable to save us if he were not God! Such is the need to constantly ponder Jesus' life, death and resurrection to avoid many a thought that does not present Jesus as 'God in a human way' and 'man in a Godly way' as a famous theologian coined!

With Lent around the corner, we too could ponder a little. Would the sacraments as actions of Christ lose their importance to us if Jesus were not God, the second person of the Blessed Trinity? If John of the Cross is correct in stating that 'One thought alone of man is worth more than the entire world....' then why not make it dwell on this mystery a while!
