The Year of Faith

The Year of Faith, which began on 11 October 2012, is drawing to a close and it has been good to have had this invitation to consider and to strengthen the place of faith in our lives. It often seems that the world we live in is especially challenging to faith, and yet the world of St Teresa of Avila threw up perhaps even greater challenges. In 16th Century Europe, the established order was changing dramatically; Christendom was breaking up, entire nations (including our own) were repudiating the Catholic faith, leading Teresa to cry out to God, in words we might use today, "Is it not enough, Lord, that the world has intimidated us, so that we may not do anything worthwhile for you in public or dare speak some truths... Don't allow any more harm to come to Christianity, Lord. Give light now to these darknesses".

St Teresa's response to the confusion of her times was to gather around herself a group of women who shared her conviction that the interests of the Church were best defended by prayer, and that prayer itself was the deepest expression of faith.
