# "Tongues of Fire" - Sacred Music

This Carmelite Priory was founded in 1862 by **Fr. Hermann Cohen.** He had already built up an international reputation as a musician and composer. He was a student, and later became a companion of Franz Liszt. When he built the Church in 1866 he had a *Cavaille-Coll* Organ [famous French organ-builders] installed, and among the organists to play at the grand opening was a young 21 year-old Charles-Marie Widor.

From the beginning, music and choirs have been a very important part of this Church. That is still true today and it is this tradition I would like to celebrate today in this series of *Tongues of Fire* [signs of the Holy Spirit]. I am reminded of the famous words of St Augustine: "he who sings prays twice". Those who sing and play music lead us all in prayer, praise and worship. The beauty of their sound and words lifts our hearts and minds to God and remind us of the eternal worship of God in heaven. Furthermore, the Church has always used music and song, like other art forms, as a means of proclaiming the Gospel.

11.00am Choir: This choir has a long and rich history. It is much loved and is the reason so many people come to this Church. Not only on Sundays but so many special occasions are enriched by the music of our organist and singers. "You expose us to the richness of the Church's music tradition and in doing so you raise our hearts and minds to the beauty, wonder and mystery of God and his presence in human life".

The Church teaches: "The musical tradition of the universal Church is a treasure of inestimable value, greater even than any other art form. The main reason for this pre-eminence is that, as a combination of sacred music and words, it forms a necessary or integral part of solemn liturgy".

**10.00am Choir:** "You are the heart of our biggest and most alive congregation. The faith and prayer life of so many of our families, children, adults and others is built up through the help and leadership of your music and singing. Your role in our parish has grown and developed over the years. You act as hosts for our *Parish Gathering* and thus play a

**Santo Niño** celebration is probably the largest congregation we get in our Church and is a very visible witness to the power of faith and prayer".

Sunday Evening Choir: This Mass is much loved by so many people. The choir helps to make this Mass a very prayerful and profound experience. Singing in a choir, playing music in Church, are acts of service and leadership. Those who do so are enriched and changed by the experience. They are also challenged to use and develop their gifts. The choir has been using its gifts to raise funds for Charity. The many Carol Concerts and other special events are a consequence of people's commitment to serve God in this way. I remember with great joy the Carol Concerts at the Tube Station – a powerful witness to Christianity and the real meaning of Christmas.

Finally, the Church reminds us that the purpose of Church music is "the glory of God and the sanctification of the faithful". There are so many signs that these two purposes are being fulfilled by our choirs and musicians. This is truly a work of the **Holy Spirit** in our midst. God is given glory through gifted people who give their time and expertise to lead us all in prayer and worship. We are all drawn closer to God through this and are inspired to other works of charity and service.
