Holy People

Today we celebrate the Feast of **All Saints.** These are the people who have lived Christianity well, people we call <u>Holy.</u> Yet when we ask the question: <u>What is Holiness?</u> we find it very difficult to come up with a satisfactory answer. I would like to pick out some aspects of Holiness, some characteristics or traits of these people.

Humility: Holy people are in touch with their own weakness, vulnerability and failures. They know their own truth and are at peace with it. Humble people do not seek to stand out, they do not seek fame or favour.

Compassion: They are merciful, understanding and compassionate. They do not judge or condemn. A holy person has a profound understanding and sympathy for human weakness.

Goodness: A holy person believes in the goodness of humanity, they can see the goodness in every person and promote that goodness.

Peace: These people are at peace with who they are and with the human condition. This peace is visible and is experienced by those who come into contact with them. Being in the presence of this peace makes one feel good.

Pain: All the saints speak about pain and suffering. They do not deliberately seek pain and suffering but they accept it as part of human life. They do all they can to alleviate suffering but more importantly they show us the way to accepting suffering in a creative and positive way. Often the greatness of the saint is seen in times of suffering, hardship or danger.

Freedom: These people are never fully understood or accepted. There is something that cannot be defined or controlled about them. They have a freedom to be themselves that others find baffling or threatening. Therefore they frequently have enemies – people who do not accept them or see them as disruptions to the prevailing order. Saints never conform to the expectations of others, society or tradition.

Mystery: There is something about a saint that cannot be defined, they seem to have something extra or see more than the rest of us.

Attractiveness: People are drawn to saints. We want to be in their presence and have what they have – though we may not want to do what is required to have what they have!

BCL easyPDF Printer Driver **Influence:** Holy people have influence, though they do not seek it. Their influence is not confined or limited by time or circumstances. Their words, actions and views are respected. They are listened to and their advice is sought even if not always followed.

These are some characteristics of people who have allowed the grace of God work in their lives. These people are all around us, often very hidden but they make a huge contribution to our world. They give human life a quality and richness it so badly needs – without them human life would be empty, superficial and harsh.
