Good Shepherd Sunday

Our Psalm today "The Lord is my shepherd" must be one of the best known and most loved of the 150 Psalms in the bible. It is particularly popular at funerals. These are times of loss, pain and grief and therefore times when we most need the reassurance, support and strength that comes from the Word of God. Today is traditionally known as "Good Shepherd Sunday" because our Gospel today is an extract from Jesus' teaching about himself as the Good Shepherd.

We may be surprised to hear Jesus describing himself as the "Gate". This is a very unusual and original image for God, yet when we think about it we can see its meaning and depth. Jesus is the "Gate" that allows us to enter that place of security, peace and freedom that we all long for. In fact, it is the deepest desire of the human heart. Where is that place? It is deep within us. Jesus is the "gate" to the "sheepfold" of the human heart. Only through Jesus can we really come to know our true selves and find the peace, security and inner freedom we so desire.

Our Psalm today expresses our prayer for this gift but only Jesus can take us there. He tells us: "I have come that they may have life and have it to the full". We all readily say yes to this but we do not always say yes to the road he marks out for us. We need today to think about the "thieves and brigands" that we allow into our lives. These are the forces, desires, addictions, habits, attitudes and relationships that compromise or destroy our freedom, peace and security. All of these take away something that is essential to our identity. The thieves and brigands lead us subtly into a life that is false, energy-sapping and lacking inner peace and freedom.
