Sunday Mass

For us Catholics, the Mass is the centre of our Christian lives. Attending Mass on Sunday defines us as Catholics. Despite the fact that we attend Mass regularly, some of us all our lives, the Mass can sometimes [or frequently!] be uninspiring, not life-giving, boring, just a duty to be fulfilled etc.

There is a question in today's Gospel that we could ask ourselves: "Have I been with you all this time, Philip, and you still do not know me?" This is an astonishing question. Philip is one of Jesus' twelve Apostles, one of the people closest to Jesus during his life and ministry; how could he possibly not know Jesus! Perhaps we could rephrase the question for ourselves:

Have I not been nourishing you with my word and my body and blood every time you come to the Eucharist and you still do not know me?

Have I given you my Holy Spirit in Baptism and Confirmation and you still do not know me?

Have I not given you the gift of grace to live a Christian life and you still do not know me?

The response that Jesus gives to Philip can help us to make our Sunday Eucharist a richer and more life-giving experience. The response is an invitation to enter into a deeper personal relationship with Jesus and to partake in the work of Jesus in our world. A Sunday Eucharist is a gathering together of those who have a deep personal relationship with Jesus, a relationship that has been nourished with prayer, scripture reflection and Christian living throughout the week. The Sunday Eucharist is a celebration of the Christian lives that all those present have been living since the last gathering for the Eucharist.

Our participation in the Eucharist is not confined to the hour we spend in Church each Sunday. Jesus gave his disciples the Eucharist at the Last Supper but it is a celebration of his death and resurrection – his greatest work. In our Gospel today he tells us: "I tell you most solemnly, whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, he will perform even greater works because I am going to the Father".

We cannot claim to do greater work than Jesus but Jesus, working through us as Church, continues his work of saving the world ["When we eat this bread and drink this blood, we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus, until you come again"]. Those who partake in the Eucharist carry on the work of Jesus in this world.

Jesus in his response to Philip, shows us that this is how God intended it to be: "It is the Father living in me, who is doing this work". The Eucharist is not just an event that takes place every Sunday, it is a mystery that is lived out every day in the life of a Christian.
