Sunday 13 March 2011 - First Sunday of Lent

Fed by the Living Word

This Sunday we include with the Newsletter the Second of our series "Praying the Mass". The title "Praying the Mass" is an important one – we each come to Church to <u>pray</u> the mass. Often we tend to see ourselves as attending the mass or being present at the mass. Being present at mass is not like being at a football match or a concert – at mass everyone is praying the mass, everyone is fully participating in what is happening. Today we are asked to reflect on the part of the mass we call the "Liturgy of the Word". We listen to readings from the Old Testament, including a psalm and the New Testament, including the Gospel, and these are followed by the Homily [note the word "listening" not "reading" [all books should be put away while the Word of God is being read!] The Word of God is meant to be listened to – the act of listening in a prayerful and attentive way, brings the word of God to life. The word is alive and active now, it is not just recounting the past or communicating information. The word is personal and is heard through the voice of the reader by each person present in a way that is unique and personal to each person.

The **Reader** is one of the most important ministers in the Church. These are the people whose vocation is to lead all of us in listening to and praying God's word. An effective reader is a person of prayer – a person who lives a deep personal prayer life that is nourished and inspired by the Word of God. The reader spends time prayerfully preparing the Word of God. The reader is a <u>servant</u> of God's word, it is God speaking through the reader – not the reader speaking on behalf of God.

We pray God's word, we listen to God's word and we respond to God's word with our minds, hearts and voices. The vocation of our **singers and musicians** is to enhance our praying and listening, and to lead us into a deeper and fuller response to all that God is revealing to us in his Word. The singers and musicians spend many hours learning and rehearsing – this is an act of great generosity and service to God and his people. However, their most important preparation is their personal prayer. The ministry of a singer or musician is a ministry of service to God's Word and a ministry of leadership – leading the congregation's prayerful praise, worship and thanksgiving to God.

In the **Homily**, the priest helps us enter more deeply into God's word. The homily is an integral and essential part of the *Liturgy of the Word*. Its purpose is to aid a deeper listening to the scriptures and to help each of us see the relevance of God's word to our lives today. The sources of a good homily are the priest's personal prayer life, his study of God's word and his listening to the stories and reality of people's lives in his daily ministry as a priest. It is a gift and privilege to hear God's word. Every Sunday we hear God's word in the context of the Eucharist, we are nourished by his Word and his Body. We must never underestimate the power that this gift is in our lives. A gift whose power and effectiveness is summed up so beautifully in the ancient words of the prophet Isaiah:

"Yes, as the rain and the snow come down from the heavens and do not return without watering the earth, making it yield and giving growth to provide seed for the sower and bread for the eating, so the Word that goes from my mouth does not return to me empty, without carrying out my will and succeeding in what it was sent to do".
