Sunday 3 April 2011 – Fourth Sunday of Lent (Laetare Sunday)

I am the Light of the World

"You were darkness once, but now you are <u>light</u> in the Lord; be like children of light, for the effects of the light are seen in complete goodness and right living and truth".

This statement from St Paul we find in our second reading today. We must first consider its background:

- 1. At the beginning of the bible we are told that all is darkness and void. Then God says: "Let there be light". Without light there is no life. Life begins when God lets light into our world.
- 2. John begins his Gospel by telling us that the Word [Jesus] is the "true light that enlightens all people, and he is coming into the world". Now it is no longer understood as physical light, but true life comes from the light that is Jesus Christ. This is demonstrated in our Gospel today a man who is born blind [that is, never seen physical light] can see with the light that faith in Jesus gives. The lack of physical light is no obstacle.
- 3. In our Gospel today Jesus tells us: "I am the <u>light</u> of the world". In John's Gospel whenever we hear an "I am" statement, we know Jesus is revealing something of his divinity. Jesus gives life, sustains all life and guarantees us eternal life.
- 4. Now St Paul is telling us that every Christian is <u>light</u> because of the union with Christ that comes about with our baptism. Now the light of the world is Jesus living in his Church and in each baptised person who lives a life of "goodness and right living and truth".

This wonderful statement from St Paul is a powerful reminder to us of who we are as baptised Christians.

One of the most moving moments of the baptism ceremony is the giving of the lighted candle to the newly-baptised person. In the case of an adult, the Godparent gives the lighted candle to the newly-baptised – in the case of a child, a Godparent holds the candle on behalf of the child. A parent physically gives life to a child, so a Godparent "parents" the life of God in the newly-baptised person.

The lighted candle is a symbol of the light of Jesus Christ which is passed on to the new Christian. The new Christian now lives the fullness of life that Jesus, the "Light of the World", gives in baptism.

Today's readings invite us to reflect on what it means to have received the Light of Christ in baptism. To help us, perhaps we could all pray the prayer that will be said today over all those preparing to receive Baptism and Confirmation this Easter:

"Lord Jesus, you are the true light that enlightens the world. Through your Spirit of truth, free those who are enslaved by the father, of lies. Stir up the desire for good in these elect, whom you have chosen for your sacraments. Let them rejoice in your light, that they may see, and, like the man born blind whose sight you restored, let them prove to be staunch and fearless witnesses to the faith, for you are Lord forever and ever. Amen
