The Mass

You may be aware that this autumn throughout the English speaking world we will begin using a new translation of the Mass. The official text of the Mass throughout the western Catholic Church is in Latin and then translated into the various other languages. The translation we currently use was done in the early 1970s and is now being replaced. However, the Church is very keen to ensure that this is not just a change in words but an opportunity for all of us to deepen our understanding and appreciation of this great gift that Jesus Christ gave to us and has been faithfully handed down to us by earlier generations.

Each month for the next five months we will be given a reflection page to help us reflect on one particular aspect of the Mass. This month we are asked to reflect on the Opening Rites of the Mass. The main elements are:

Gathering: We come together as a community from a vast variety of personal and family situations, employment, schools, colleges, social and cultural lives, life experience etc. We bring our gifts, our joys, our problems, our worries, our dreams and our relationships. We make the journey to Church filled with faith and hope, we pray and reflect silently and we open our hearts to what God will give us in this Eucharist. At some of our Masses all this is brought together and expressed in an opening hymn.

Penitential Rite: We always come before God as sinners. The Eucharist is the sacrament of forgiveness. We truthfully review the past week, we sincerely ask pardon for our sins and we pray that our hearts may be transformed by God's mercy.

Gloria: This song of praise, worship and thanksgiving begins with the words the Angels sang as they announced the good news of the birth of Jesus to the shepherds. The words of the *GLORIA* are a powerful reminder to us of where we are, in whose presence we are in and of the attitude that should now be in our minds and hearts.

Collect (opening prayer): The priest now gathers together the prayers of the whole community with the words: *Let us pray*. After a period of silence, this prayer expresses the main theme of our celebration, usually by recalling one of the great deeds of God or one of his promises. For example, today's "Collect" recalls the promise of God to remain forever with those who do what is right and just.

This is then followed by a prayer of petition. Today's is a short but very profound one: *help us to live in your presence*. Prayerful reading and reflection on the "*Collect*" is a very enriching way to prepare for our Sunday Mass.
