Trust Him at all Times

"Do not worry" - we hear these words from the lips of Jesus in our Gospel today. They are words we all use. Just think of how often we say these words to others; to reassure, comfort, and help. The truth is we all worry, no words of reassurance changes that. Worry is not something bad or evil – the ability to worry is a gift God has given us, it is part of who we are as human beings. Worry only becomes damaging or destructive when it is excessive or relentless.

We all develop ways of coping with worry and this is good and healthy. However, we all find ourselves in situations where worry just becomes too much, times when we cannot cope.

Our scripture readings today give us some very good advice for dealing with worry. Let us begin with our first reading – the people of Israel are in exile, they feel alone, they feel God has abandoned them. Worry isolates us, we feel no one knows, recognises or understands, God feels very distant. The words of God spoken through the prophet to the people of Israel are very reassuring; Zion was saying, "The Lord has abandoned me, the Lord has forgotten me". Does a woman forget her baby at the breast, or fail to cherish the son of her womb? Yet even if these forget, I will never forget you.

Our Gospel invites us to look at the bigger picture – worry narrows our vision, we focus on what is on our minds and ignore everything else. Jesus advises: "Set your hearts on His kingdom first, and on His righteousness". When we are worried we become self-centred and we often ignore God, other people and our obligation to do what is right.

When we are worried we either do not pray – we are so centred on ourselves that we forget God. Or we pray in the wrong way – our prayer takes us more deeply into our worry rather than lifting us out of it. The **Psalms** are particularly good prayers for times of worry. These scriptural prayers do the following:

- * They focus directly on God and not on me or what is worrying me.
- * They give words and images that allow me to express my deepest feelings, worry, anxiety, fear or pain.

- * The Psalms are works of art and beauty; we need art and beauty at times of worry.
- * The Psalms have been prayed for centuries and millennia. They connect me with the whole people of God.
- * Trust is the key to overcoming worry. Lack of trust or failure in trust is at the root of most damaging or destructive worry. Human trust is not enough, only trust in God can take us through this. The Psalms repeat this message over and over again.

Today's extract from Psalm 61 is a very appropriate prayer for times of worry:

In God alone is my soul at rest, my help comes from him. He alone is my rock, my stronghold, my fortress; I stand firm.

In God alone be at rest, my soul; for my hope comes from him. He alone is my rock, my stronghold, my fortress; I stand firm.

In God is my safety and glory, the rock of my strength. Take refuge in God all you people. Trust him at all times. Pour out your hearts before him.
