Sunday 17 April 2011 – Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion Holy Week

This weekend we begin Holy Week, the most important week of our Christian year. The core of our Christian faith is to be found in the death and resurrection of Jesus. It is essential that we prepare well so as to make this week a deep and personal spiritual experience.

I would like to share some short reflections from **the writings of St John of the Cros**s. I recommend you spend time with each of these, make them a source of prayer and reflection, and allow them to lead you more deeply into this great mystery.

- * "There is much to fathom in Christ for he is like an abundant mine with many recesses of treasures, so that however deep individuals may go they never reach the end or the bottom, but rather in every recess find new veins with new riches everywhere".
- * "Mine are the heavens and mine is the earth. Mine are the nations, the just are mine and mine the sinners. The angels are mine, and the Mother of God, and all things are mine; and God himself is mine and for me, because Christ is mine and all for me".
- * "For on this road there is room only for self denial, as our Saviour asserts, and the cross. The cross is a supporting staff and greatly lightens and eases the journey".
- * "A person only makes progress by imitating Christ who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. No one goes to the Father but through him. Accordingly, I would not consider any spirituality worthwhile that wants to walk in sweetness and ease and run from the imitation of Christ".
- * "From my observations, Christ is little known by those who consider themselves his friends. For we see them going about seeking in him their own consolations and satisfactions, loving themselves very much, but not loving him very much by seeking his bitter trials and death".
- * "Bear fortitude in your heart against all things that move you to that which is not God, and be a friend of the Passion of Christ".
- * "He who seeks not the cross of Christ seeks not the glory of Christ".
- * "Never take others for your example in the tasks you have to perform, however holy they may be, for the devil will set their imperfections before you. But imitate Christ who is supremely perfect and supremely holy, and you will never err".

- * "God could answer: If you desire me to answer with a word of comfort, behold my Son subject to me and to others out of love for me, and afflicted, and you will see how much he answers you. If you desire me to declare some secret truths or events, fix your eyes only on Him, and you will discern hidden in him the most secret mysteries and wisdom and wonders of God".
- * "Those who do not relish this language God speaks within them must not think on this account that others do not taste it. St Peter tasted it in his soul when he said to Christ: Lord, where shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. And the Samaritan woman forgot the water and the water jar for the sweetness of God's words".
- * "Lord, you love discretion, you love light, you love love: these three you love above the other operations of the soul. Hence these will be sayings of discretion for the wayfarer, of light for the way, and of love in the wayfaring".
- * "O Lord, my God, who will seek you with simple and pure love, and not find that you are all one can desire? For you show yourself first and go out to meet those who seek you".
