Tongues of Fire

I came to this Church a little over six years ago. In that time I have written on many subjects in this Newsletter. For the remaining weeks that I am here I would like to share some reflections on life in this Church. To use the language of today's **Feast of Pentecost**, I will be looking around this parish and seeing where the Holy Spirit is at work. The Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles "*like Tongues of Fire*". These are the human lives and voices through whom the Holy Spirit speaks, sometimes audibly, often silently but always at the service of building up God's kingdom, making the love of Jesus better known and making this world a better place.

Today's "Tongues of Fire" are our children. Shortly after coming here, two mothers came to see me and asked: Can we do something for the children? When we look at the 10.00am Mass now we can only marvel at how the seed sown that day has grown. We have families from "every nation under heaven", bigger numbers than ever preparing for sacraments, catechism classes for every age group and a great variety of other activities for our children. This has happened because a great number of people have responded to the voice of the Holy Spirit calling us as a parish to this ministry. Those who have responded are the children themselves, parents, catechists, and many others who support this work in so many ways. So the "tongues of fire" I invite you to celebrate today are:-

Children: Children are born with a limitless capacity to receive the word of God. I invite all our children to share with your friends the joy and happiness of knowing Jesus Christ. Let everyone know that coming to Church is something important, exciting and joyful. A lovely example of this are the works of art that greet everyone who enters the Priory. Each of these is a "tongue of fire", a statement of faith, often coming from some of our youngest children. Never underestimate how much good this does.

Parents: Bringing your children to Church, teaching them to pray, encouraging them to receive the sacraments, passing on to them the wisdom and strength that Christian faith gives to you, are all works of the Holy Spirit. These are "tongues of fire" that your children will treasure all their lives.



Remember also that the children are "tongues of fire" in your lives.

Often when I am with couples preparing for marriage they will share their desire that if they have children they want to bring them up with the Christian faith they were brought up with. Sometimes parents return to Church when they have children. Parents are challenged to learn more about their faith when they begin to try to pass on their faith to their children. There are many ways in which children are instrumental in deepening the faith of parents.

Catechists: You are the people who share your time, talents and faith experience with the Christian leaders of the future. Sitting in front of you are the parents, teachers, politicians, industrialists, bankers, priests, religious etc. of the future. Only the Holy Spirit knows where the "tongues of fire" that you allow Him to speak through you, are going to reach and influence.

At **Pentecost** the "tongues of fire" reached people of "every nation under heaven" and they all understood in "their own language". Let us thank and praise God that this is happening right here in our midst.
