Sunday 17 July 2011 – Sixteenth Sunday of the Year

"According to the Mind of God"

For a number of weeks I have been writing a series of reflections on life in this Church community. I have chosen some signs of the *Holy Spirit's* work and given them the title "*Tongues of Fire*", taken from the account of Pentecost in the *Acts of the Apostles*. The series could have gone on forever but the time has come to bring it to a close. What all the signs have in common is that they show how God is making himself known through people who are willing to give their time, talents and experience.

The signs are visible, positive, encouraging and life-giving. They are also calls to us all to live our faith more deeply and to do all we can to make Jesus and the Gospel better known.

St Paul, in our second reading today, reminds us that the Holy Spirit works in other ways also – ways that are invisible and seem difficult and challenging to us. We need to listen to this reading again and note carefully what is being said: "The Spirit comes to help us in our weakness. For when we cannot choose words in order to pray properly, the Spirit himself expresses our plea in a way that could never be put into words, and God who knows everything in our hearts knows perfectly well what He means, and that the pleas of the saints expressed by the Spirit are according to the mind of God."

When we feel weak, when we do not know what to do, when we have no answers, when we are confused, frightened or helpless, these are the times when the Holy Spirit helps us. He helps us in ways that are secret, unknown to the person who is being helped – help that cannot be put into words, that is known and understood only by God. Sometimes it is only when we look back from a distance of time or experience that we can get a glimpse of this secret, mysterious but very powerful help of the Holy Spirit. So, when we look around our communities, society or our personal lives for signs of the Holy Spirit's work, we have to look also at the failures, tragedies, unsolved problems and lack of progress.

only spirit is in these situations too and perhaps doing some great work. St Paul is looking around his Christian communities through the eyes of faith and seeing the grace of God at work where we human beings only see weakness and failure.

St Paul is not saying that we must accept failure or weakness in an indifferent or fatalistic way. On the contrary, he is saying that in times of weakness and failure, we must trust the Holy Spirit that we have received and always live with faith and hope. When we do this, then our prayers and everything else we do are "according to the mind of God". That is what is meant by the term "Tongues of Fire" — when the message communicated through our actions, decisions, words and attitudes are "according to the mind of God". That can happen when things are going well or going badly, in success or failure, in strength or weakness, visibly or invisibly, but always as the Spirit decides and acts, but never according to our plans, schemes or desires.
