Remembering and Praying

Not too long ago we as Church celebrated two days that remind us of who we are: *All Saints* and *All Souls*. All Saints reminded us of our hope in a definite end to the pain and sorrow experienced in this life. St Thérèse taught that this end does not leave behind the "friendships forged in this life". The saints have not arrived at a destination – the eternal enjoyment of God alone, and forgot about us. But in their communion with us, they want to spend their "heaven doing good upon the earth". They pray for us to be where they are, in God.

If *All Saints* reminds us of the desires of all saints to help us towards our end in God, *All Souls* reminds us on earth that we too can express God's desire for all to be in communion with him, that we can pray for those who are undergoing a purification and intensification of God's love, to help them gain their eternal reward. These two days remind us that we are a Church that prays together. We grasp that prayer begins with a desire, which we experience as our own, that we want to do this and, like those in heaven, grow into a realisation that our praying does help others. A prayer like this expresses God's will. We want what God wants for our family, friends and strangers. It is a wholesome thought to pray for the dying and those who have died.

That's why a day like **Remembrance Sunday** — though a civil commemoration — should be part of our communal memory. Thousands were deprived of a natural death due to wars. Our families have been affected by tragic loss and sadly it is still a reality today. As we remember them for the sacrifice they made, let's not stop at that — remembering those who gave their lives for our freedom and that is it! Let us remember there is a spiritual war going on that tries to paralyse families and friends in their grief and loss. As a praying Church, heaven and earth unites us to our loved ones; let our prayer realise the "separations" death has brought to our relationships with others. But equally let us believe that our prayer,

even now, can help others struggling, stammering, straining to make sense of death, which the Book of Wisdom tells us: was "never of God's fashioning; not for his pleasure does life cease to be". If only to help those of us left behind in grief and sorrow to remain confident that death does not have the last say but "Life, Love and Light" will await us as Blessed Elizabeth of the Trinity spoke with her last breath....

Taize Reflects

The Gospel unsettles us, draws us out of ourselves and challenges us. It does this, not to alienate us from ourselves, but to awaken us to what is deepest and truest within us. In this sense, we are reminded of the words of E Mounier: "The other is not a limit to the self, but a source of the self".
