The Eucharist

In Ireland the **54th International Eucharistic Congress** draws to a close. As an international event, various speakers were invited from all walks of life to reflect on the theme: "The Eucharistic: Communion with Christ and with one another". For me this international gathering seems to be focused on the hope that a particular Christian sense of lifestyle is borne from participation in the Eucharist. The assumption is that those who take part in the Eucharist will help inform themselves of choices they need to make. Not only this but will receive the help to carry change through when needed.

YouTubing the event, I could not help but think that, in this year celebrating the 50th Anniversary of the opening of the second Vatican Council, questions relating to the identity of what it means to be Church automatically arise when reflecting on the nature of Eucharist. The Congress is one more event that helps us see that the Church is not really Church if "she" is not celebrating the Eucharist. Paul, in his *Letter to the Corinthians*, used the theme of unity found in the gathering around the table of the Lord. In their midst the rich were ignoring the needs of the poor called to work later than they in the fields. They seem to have a meal laid on for all but did not wait for all to arrive. So when the poorer among them arrived, the food had been well dipped into!

Paul does not lose time in pointing out and questioning is what they celebrate the Lord's supper? The Eucharist can change our lifestyle because it is Christ we receive who challenges how we can live differently and for the better. This Sunday we witness again children receiving their **First Holy Communion.** Perhaps this too will make us reflect on whether or not we do take part in the Eucharist, aware of the grace available that can help influence our lifestyles because Christ desires to be part of our lives.
