Blessed John Henry Newman

Today John Henry Newman is being **Beatified in Birmingham by Pope Benedict.** From an early age the thinking and theology of Pope Benedict have been deeply influenced by Cardinal Newman. Therefore this event has great personal significance for the Holy Father. This is the first time a Beatification has ever taken place on English soil and it is taking place in the city of Birmingham where Newman lived and ministered from 1848 until his death in 1890. For the Mass of Beatification they are using the same scripture readings as are used throughout the Church today. Therefore it is appropriate for us to listen to **Blessed John Henry Newman's** reflection on today's Gospel:

"Such will the holy truths of the Gospel ever appear to those who live to this world, whether they love its pleasures, its comforts, its prizes, or its struggles; their eyes are waxen gross, they cannot see Christ spiritually. When they see Him, there is no beauty in Him that they should desire Him. Thus they become unbelieving. In our Lord's words, 'No servant can serve two masters: for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will hold to the one and desire the other. Ye cannot serve God and mammon'. When he said this, the Pharisees derided Him. And he said onto them, 'Ye are they which justify yourselves before men; but God knoweth your hearts for that which is highly esteemed among men is abomination in the sight of God'. God grant that we may not be of those who 'justify themselves before men' and 'deride' those who preach the severe doctrine of the cross! God grant that, if we have misgivings about the corruptions and defects of the religion now so popular among us, we may have the grace forthwith to desire honestly to know God's will! God grant that we may not attempt to deceive our consciences, and to reconcile together, by some artifice or other, the service of this world and of God! God grant that we may not pervert and dilute his holy word, and put upon it the false interpretations of men, reason ourselves out of its strictness, and reduce religion to an ordinary common-place matter - instead of thinking it what it is, a mysterious and supernatural subject, as distinct from anything that lies on the surface of this world, as day is from night and heaven from earth!" This sermon was preached by Newman while he was Vicar of St Mary the Virgin, the University Church in Oxford.

His congregation, undergraduates and people of Oxford, were living in a world steeped in Christianity and Christian traditions and thinking. It was a world that would change drastically during Newman's lifetime and he would find himself having to face many new questions.

Many years later, as a Catholic Priest, he would reflect on these changes and the kind of world that was emerging and where he felt [or feared] it might lead to and how Christianity itself will be challenged. He summed it up like this: "Christianity has never yet had experience of a world simply irreligious". We could argue that we are now living in the kind of world Newman predicted [and feared!]. We live in a world where many people have no concept of religious belief, no idea of a God or what "revealed" religion might mean. Newman's life is a story of controversies and challenges, it is also a story of growing and deepening faith and a clear and profound articulation of that faith. His experience is a guide and encouragement to us, he does not give us all the answers but he gives us the courage and the direction to seek them. Newman was never afraid of new questions or painful decisions – for him this is where the cross was, it is in the midst of what is most painful that we are closest to our Saviour and to salvation.

Let me thus praise Thee in the way Thou dost love best by shining on those around me.
Let me preach Thee without preaching, not by words but by

example, by the catching force of the sympathetic influence of what I do, the evident fullness of the love my heart bears to Thee.
