"Dear Young Friends...." [Pope Benedict]

We all have many thoughts, memories and perhaps questions and challenges after the Holy Father's visit. He invited us to reflect on what it means to live deep, meaningful and fruitful Christian lives in our world of today. Pope Benedict is acutely aware that this challenge is felt most by our younger people. I would like to pick out two things from the messages he addressed specifically to young people:

"I ask you to look into your hearts each day to find the source of all true love. Jesus is always there, quietly waiting for us to be still with him and to hear his voice. Deep within your heart he is calling you to spend time with him in prayer. But this kind of prayer, real prayer, requires discipline; it requires making time for moments of silence every day. Often it means waiting for the Lord to speak. Even amid the "busy-ness" and the stress of our daily lives, we need to make space for silence, because it is in silence that we find God, and in silence that we discover our true self. And in discovering our true self, we discover the particular vocation which God has given us for the building up of his Church and the redemption of our world".

"Only Jesus knows what 'definite service' he has in mind for you. Be open to his voice resounding in the depths of your heart: even now his heart is speaking to your heart. Christ has need of families to remind the world of the dignity of human love and the beauty of family life. He needs men and women who devote their lives to the noble task of education, tending the young and forming them in the ways of the Gospel. He needs those who will consecrate their lives to the pursuit of perfect charity, following him is chastity, poverty and obedience, and serving him in the least of our brothers and sisters. He needs the powerful love of contemplative religious, who sustain the Church's witness and activity through their constant prayer. And he needs priests, good and holy priests, men who are willing to lay down their lives for their sheep. Ask our Lord what he has in mind for you! Ask him for the generosity to say 'yes'. Do not be afraid to give yourself totally to Jesus. He will give you the grace you need to fulfil your vocation"

These are important and timely words and must not be left unheeded. There are many ways and opportunities for you to sustain and build up your faith. I would like to speak about three examples here at our Church:-

Monday Group: For many years now there is an open meeting of young adults every Monday evening for prayer, faith sharing, mutual support and formation in faith. Only God knows the number of people whose faith has been sustained and developed by this group and are now serving God and his people throughout the world. I invite all young people who come to our Church to come along whenever you can. [8.00-9.30pm each Monday, entrance from Pitt St.].

<u>Carmelite Youth Day:</u> We are now preparing for the sixth <u>Carmelite Youth Day</u>. Each year we take a Carmelite Saint as our inspiration. This year our faith and prayer will be nourished by the writing and example of **St John of the Cross.** These days are always joyful, stimulating and a profound experience for all who attend. So please come along on Saturday 23 October at 12.00 Noon till 5.00pm.

Young Adult Retreats: We have two retreats each year for young adults. The next one is 19-21 November, 2010, at the Carmelite Priory, Boars Hill, Oxford. Even if you have never been on a retreat before, please consider this, it is an excellent opportunity to experience a little of the silence and prayer that Pope Benedict is speaking about.
