He Thanked Jesus

"Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? Ten people are cured of the very painful, debilitating and much feared disease of leprosy. Only one returns to give thanks and praise to God. Before we jump in and start condemning the nine, perhaps we need to look more closely at the lesson being illustrated by this story.

These ten people have every reason to be grateful to Jesus for healing them. Yet only one is able to, or is willing to see the need to return and give thanks to Jesus. Why is this? That is the question the story leaves unanswered but invites us to search for the answer. That "something" that keeps the nine away is to be found deep within each one of us; it is the main stumbling block in our relationships with each other and in our relationship with God. These ten people represent us all. Everything we have, are, achieve, know etc. is a gift of God. Most of us, almost all the time are among the nine. The one who gives thanks is the rare exception – someone who can see what God has done for him and is moved to give thanks and praise to God because of this.

This lesson is confirmed in the Church's choice of first reading to accompany this Gospel. The Syrian Naaman, has gone down in Biblical history, not because he is miraculously healed, but because of his determination to give thanks and praise to God. He is held up as an example to an ungrateful Israel to whom God has given far more but they cannot see this.

It is one of the great mysteries of our relationship with God and one of the great obstacles to growth in our lives of prayer – we cannot recognise, or we refuse to recognise, that we are in debt to God, he has given us everything.

Both our first reading and our Gospel today illustrate to us the close relationship between thanksgiving and prayer, praise and worship. Those who recognise their need to thank God become people of prayer and faith. All worship is thanksgiving and the fruit of gratitude.

The word "Eucharist" means thanksgiving – just imagine how rich, meaningful, joyful and profound our celebrations of the Eucharist would be if we had the spirit and wisdom of that healed leper who returned to Jesus.
