"Christianity is not about ideas but about Deeds **Inspired by Love**" (Blessed Frederic Ozanam)

Post-Confirmation teenagers pose a difficulty for us priests and parents. Yes, really! What are we to do with you now that you have received the Sacrament of **Initiation** that has made you a full, active participant in the life of the Church? Put your hands up if you think you are now an active member of the Church. No? Well, to put you in the picture, parents and priests think we now have the responsibility to keep you active in the life of the Church community. Yes, really! We are thinking that you may now start to drift away from the Sacraments altogether! That the "world" may be attracting you away from your faith responsibilities! It is a real thought that looms behind every concerned parent and Parish Priest! There is also the flip side – we actually think your gift of faith is for the world. How do we help sustain the gift you received and not have us believe that confirmation is more a Sacrament of exit than one that has now empowered you to influence the life of the Church in the world?

Without a doubt the Church cannot compete with the clubs and events that the entertainment world offers. Many parishes have tried setting up writing clubs, chess clubs, book clubs, music clubs, football clubs and leagues! Inevitably it's all been tried and found wanting as it mostly appealed to a few teenagers among the many. It may be indicative that this is not what you want from your Church either!

So what are we to do? Give up? No way!! The mission of the parish is to create schools of prayer evidenced in a faith teaching us to be practical in our charity towards others. The Christian journey is calling us to Evangelise! In other words - share the way Jesus influences our lives for the better. Doing so helps form community - young and not so young together as followers of Christ. This includes drawing on the life energy from young people like yourselves into the pastoral activity of the Church. Evangelisation is certainly focused in turning ideas into deeds inspired by love! Deeds inspired by love is what is meant by being Pastoral

This pastoral way informs the action of the Church so that others might experience in and through us the presence of Christ. It is your call as a confirmed Catholic to become pastoral in your actions.

So I would like to invite our **Post-Confirmation candidates** – **up to the age of 16 years** – to meet and hear about the young SVP.
