You Must Love

Jesus is challenged to choose the most important commandment in the law of Israel [the experts tell us he had a choice of 613 precepts of the Torah and it was not unusual for the rabbis to debate among themselves which was the most important!] He quotes Deuteronomy 6:5 {You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind}, and Leviticus 19:18 {You must love your neighbour as yourself}.

Needless to say this was not the answer his challengers expected to hear. Jesus did not answer with the aim of winning an argument but rather to win over the hearts of the Pharisees. The most striking aspect of Jesus' response is how positive it is — most laws say what we must not do or what is forbidden. These two "laws" make the most positive statement possible - **You must love.** One of the most frequently voiced criticisms of religions, and Catholicism in particular, is that they are always telling us what we must not do. Religions are perceived to be negative and to be opposed to human happiness and freedom.

Jesus is so positive in his response here. "You must love" is the most positive and affirming statement anyone could make. The response is also an invitation to a change of heart and a change of life. The Pharisees cannot argue with Jesus' response to them but, sadly, they are also unable to accept his invitation.

Jesus concludes by telling the Pharisees: "on these two commandments hang the whole law, and the prophets also" – in other words the entire scriptures hang on these commandments. This then is what Religion. Christianity, Catholicism is all about: all Church laws, teachings, rituals and customs are about celebrating love, teaching us to love, setting us free to love and challenging us to ever deeper and more complete love.

The Pharisees live by the rules, they "live" their faith well but they have forgotten "why" they live this way. They have forgotten the purpose of God's promises, laws and worship. This Gospel is a reminder to us of what is really important – a Gospel story we should return to frequently in our prayer and reflection.

The early Christian writer, Origen, tells us when commenting on this passage of the Gospel:-

He takes something from its primacy and greatness who subtracts anything from the entirety of this commandment... They alone accept its greatness and primacy who not only love the Lord their God but have also taken it upon themselves to fulfil these three conditions;

That with their whole **heart** they hold within themselves the fullness of this love, and its thoughts and actions;

And with their whole **soul**, for God is loved with thy whole soul when no part of the soul is seized by anything that is out of keeping with the faith;

And with their whole **mind** thinking and speaking of nothing else but the things of God.
