Year of St Paul

Today, Feast of St Peter and Paul, we celebrate the closing of the Year of St Paul. One of the most striking features of Paul's letters is Prayer. His letters begin and end in prayer, several times during his letters he breaks into prayer and his letters are obviously the fruit of an intense prayer life.

Paul saw prayer as his first duty to his Christian Churches: *I thank my God whenever I think of you; and every time I pray for all of you, I pray with joy.* [Philippians]. Paul's newly-founded Churches are never out of his thoughts and prayers. I would like to pick out some aspects of prayer which we find in Paul's letters and let Paul teach us about prayer through his own words:

Greeting: Paul's relationship with his Churches is centred on their relationship with Jesus Christ: We wish you the grace and peace of God our Father and of the Lord Jesus Christ. [Philippians].

The grace of our Lord Jesus be with you. My love is with you in Christ Jesus. [1 Corinthians].

Thanksgiving: Paul is always thanking God. Whenever he thinks about his fellow Christians whom he loves so much, he turns to God in thanksgiving – I never stop thanking God for all the graces you have received through Jesus Christ. I thank him that you have been enriched in so many ways. [1 Corinthians]. We have never failed to remember you in our prayers and to give thanks for you to God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. [Colossians].

Praise: We could argue that Paul's letters are written, first and foremost, to give praise and glory to God. They are acts of worship. Though they deal with many practical issues and questions, their main focus is the love, mercy and generosity of God revealed through Jesus Christ and giving praise, thanks and worship to God for this – *Glory to him who is able to give you the strength to live according to the Good News I preach He alone is wisdom; give glory therefore to him through Jesus Christ for ever and ever. Amen.* [Romans].

Think of God's mercy, my brothers, and worship him, I beg you, in a way that is worthy of thinking beings. [Romans].

BCL easyPDF Printer Driver **Intercession:** My advice is that, first of all, there should be prayers offered for everyone – petitions, intercessions and thanksgiving and especially for Kings and others in authority... To do this is right and will please God our Saviour. In every place, then, I want men to lift their hands up reverently in prayer, with no anger or argument.

[1 Timothy]

Holy Spirit: The Spirit too comes to help us in our weakness. For when we cannot choose words in order to pray properly, the Spirit himself expresses our plea in a way that could never be put into words, and God who knows everything in our hearts, knows perfectly well what he means and that the pleas of the saints expressed by the Spirit are according to the mind of God. [Romans]

Growth in Jesus: This, then is what I pray, kneeling before the Father. Out of his infinite glory, may he give you the power through his Spirit for your hidden self to grow strong, so that Christ may live in your hearts through faith, and then, planted in love and built on love, you will with all the saints have strength to grasp the breadth and the length, the height and the depth; until, knowing the love of Christ, which is beyond all knowledge, you are filled with the utter fullness of God. [Ephesians]

This is just a taste of the richness of prayer and teaching on prayer to be found in Paul's letters. Fr Matt Blake, Prior
