# The Most Holy Trinity

In our Opening Prayer of our Mass today we pray: "Father, you sent your Word to bring us truth and your Spirit to make us holy. Through them we come to know the mystery of your life".

These are very carefully chosen words which not only sum up the mystery we celebrate today but also express the mystery in terms of the relationships at the heart of the mystery. Today we celebrate God as He is, as he has chosen to be known by us and as he wants us to relate with Him. This can all sound very vague or even technical and indeed much of our writing or teaching on the Trinity is. We tend to speak about the Trinity as if it is some kind of scientific discovery or complex formula that needs to be mastered. That is not God's intention, God wants us to know the mystery of his life and enter into a relationship with him. When we reflect upon the most important human relationships in our lives (husbands, wives, children, parents, close friends etc.), we see that each relationship is unique, complex, challenging and always changing and evolving. In truth we can never say we really know another person, there are always hidden depths, mysteries and surprises. If it is like this for the most important and significant human relationships in our lives, how much more so is it going to be for our relationship with God.

God wants us to know the mystery of his life – it is impossible for us human beings to fully know God but he wants us to know him as fully as is possible for us. As the prayer quoted above tells us, he sent us his Son to reveal the truth to us and he gives us his Spirit that we may change, grow and enter into relationship with him. We cannot celebrate the Trinity without also celebrating who we are. When we enter into a close relationship with another person we discover the truth about ourselves; this is even more true when we enter into a close relationship with God. This is a point made so well by St Paul in the extract from his Letter to the Romans that we have as our second reading today. This is a text I recommend you spend time reflecting upon and praying with; its richness takes time, attention and prayer in order to grasp its meaning.

"Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!'. The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory".
