# Visit of Pope Benedict

As you all know, Pope Benedict will be visiting England and Scotland from <u>16-19 September 2010</u>. When Pope John Paul II visited this country in 1982, his visit was a "Pastoral Visit" – its purpose was to confirm and encourage the Catholic faithful in their faith and Christian living.

This visit by Pope Benedict is very different. He has been invited by Her Majesty, the Queen, and the British government. It is the first State Visit by a Pope to this country and he will be here as an official guest of Her Majesty, the Queen. While the Vatican has declined most of the usual pomp and ceremony associated with a State Visit, it is nevertheless a State Visit with some Church events included. The main Church events will be three large gatherings in Scotland, Coventry and London. The largest of these will be the Mass of Beatification of Cardinal Newman on Sunday 19 September 2010.

It is estimated that approximately 400,000 people will be able to attend these events but details of ticket allocations, transport, security etc. have not yet been finalised.

The theme chosen for the spiritual message of the visit are the words of Cardinal Newman: *Cor ad Cor Loquitur* [*Heart speaks onto Heart*]. No doubt this will be an important theme in the public addresses of Pope Benedict.

Archbishop Vincent writes the following: "He (Pope Benedict] comes to address our society at a time of some uncertainty and, we may expect, emerging austerity. He comes as an outstanding and sensitive messenger of the Gospel and of the richness of Catholic teaching. His delicate task is to find ways in which these messages may find a hearing in our society.

Our task [as a Catholic community] is quite clear: We must support the Pope in every way we can. We must be with him, alongside him, demonstrating as far as we can the truth of his message to our society. I am sure he will show his appreciation for the wealth of our national and Christian traditions. He will encourage and invite all people to look for lasting values in our shared life. He will pray with us and lead us all in prayer that we may discover again the importance of silence, reflection and prayer in our lives.

In the Beatification of Cardinal Newman he will hold before us an example of a generous, spiritual and outstanding Christian who made a famous journey of faith in a manner which reflects so clearly many of our sensitivities and concerns. All of this is no easy task. Our support is so important."

At this time we are being invited to support the visit in two ways: **prayer** and **financial support.** As this is a State Visit, most of the cost is met by the Government. The Catholic Church, however, has to meet the costs of the Church events and this is currently estimated at approximately £7 million. Already over £3 million has been raised, and next Sunday, **Pentecost Sunday**, there will be a **special collection** in all the Churches of England, Wales and Scotland to help raise this money. *Please be as generous as you can*.
