Year for Priests

It is more than a year ago now since Pope Benedict announced the **Year for Priests** [June 2009 to June 2010]. The purpose of the year is to give all members of the Church an opportunity to reflect on the place of priests and the priesthood in the life and mission of the Church. It is an opportunity to deepen our understanding of the priesthood, to reflect on the changing role of the priest in the 21st century Church and to become more aware of how we pass on the gift to future generations. In addition we are all asked to pray for priests, for those preparing for the priesthood and for those God will call in the future to this vocation.

One of the initiatives of our Diocese has been to organise 40 Hours Eucharistic Adoration in each Deanery of the Diocese and these have been going on throughout the Diocese over the past year. As you are already aware, our Church was chosen to host the "40 Hours" for the parishes of Kensington and Chelsea. It will begin with the 6.00pm Mass next Sunday 18 April, and end with the 12.15pm Mass on Tuesday 20 April. During this time [except for the times of our usual scheduled masses] the Blessed Sacrament will be exposed and people are welcome to spend time in our Church praying. Most of the time will be silent prayer but sometimes individuals and groups will lead prayers and reflections.

You are welcome to come anytime you wish, day or night, and I hope there will be people of this parish present all the time throughout the 40 hours. However, each of the parishes involved and other groups have been assigned times to ensure that there are always sufficient people present.

The time assigned to this Carmelite Parish is Sunday night 11.00pm to Monday morning 3.00am. A list will be at the back of the Church for people to sign up for these hours. We hope and pray that these days of prayer will be a time of great grace and blessing for everyone involved.

When this "40 Hours" was first organised, no one could have predicted that it will take place in the context of all the news we are hearing of horrific abuse of children by priests, religious and others in the Church. There is so much being said about this, I would like just to share a few comments and reflections on three aspects:-

<u>Firstly</u> we are speaking about horrendous crimes that have done tragic and lasting damage to the lives of many innocent people. We must apologise to the victims and do everything we possibly can to help and support them. However, we must also seek to understand what has happened and why it happened. We do not conquer evil just by ignoring it or condemning it, we must also seek to understand it – otherwise we make the same mistakes again in different ways [just like one oppressive regime is often replaced by another, which often turns out to be just as oppressive].

<u>Secondly</u>, very often the victims did not receive the listening ear, understanding and help they should rightly receive from the Church. Healing the sick, caring for the hurt and wounded, being a voice for the oppressed, welcoming, caring for and educating children are all basic to the Church's mission. Therefore this is a failure of the Church to carry out its primary mission.

<u>Thirdly</u>, these crimes were deliberately and systematically covered-up by the Church. The reasons for this are complex but among them are the following: fear and misunderstanding of these crimes and their consequences, a strong desire to avoid scandal and uphold the "good name" of the Church, and a defective and naïve understanding of the nature of the Church and of what loyalty/obedience to the Church means.

To help explore these issues further and the many other questions and concerns people have, I would like to invite you all to a **meeting here at the Priory this Tuesday 13 April at 7.30pm**. I hope as many of you as possible will be able to come to this meeting.

The **40 Hours** is an opportunity to bring all these issues to God in prayer. In addition we are also organising a **Special Mass for victims of abuse** on **Thursday 29 April at 7.30pm**. Please pass the word around about these events.
