# **Vocations Sunday**

At Baptism each one of us is anointed with the oil of Chrism: "The God of power and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ has freed you from sin and brought you to new life through water and the Holy Spirit. He now anoints you with the chrism of salvation, so that, united with his people, you may remain forever a member of Christ who is Priest, Prophet and King".

These are the words of the *Rite of Baptism* and every time I have the privilege of pronouncing them, I am always astounded and humbled by them. What are these words going to mean for the life of this new Christian adult or baby, what is the potential contained in these words – this person's life is completely transformed by this anointing and is filled with possibilities and potential that can only be realised through the grace of God. Two important points we need to note:

- It is **God the Father** who is doing the anointing not the Church, nor the parents or godparents, nor the priest, nor the Holy Spirit, nor Jesus but God the Father. God has already freed this person from sin and brought the person to new life, now God the Father personally gives this person the capacity to partake in the life of his Son.
- The specific way we, as baptised Christians, partake in the life of Jesus is by our sharing in his power and mission as Priest, **Prophet,** and **King.** This is not something we achieve by our own efforts, rather we grow into it when we open ourselves to the workings of God's grace in us and respond with generosity to the specific call God gives to each of us.

A person's "vocation" is the relationship, situation, environment, way of life, mission or identity that enables that unique person to participate fully in the life of God's Son. When a person has grown into his/her vocation, then that person is fully alive, is true to their unique identity and communicates Jesus as priest, Prophet and King. I am not fully myself until I have grown into my "vocation" and am totally at peace with who I am, where I am and what life has brought my way. These three great titles of Jesus illustrate what this might mean.



**Priest:** The priestly life is associated with prayer, worship, sacrifice and healing. A Christian in whom the priestly power of Jesus has grown and matured is a person in whose presence we feel better, a person whose presence lifts our hearts and a person to whom we feel drawn because of the inner peace they communicate.

**Prophet:** Prophets are great listeners and their most obvious characteristic is compassion. Our pain, our unanswered questions, our dreams, our hopes and our emptiness are heard and understood by these people. They rarely speak but when they do, their words, gestures, attitudes and example have an authority, influence and depth that is not found anywhere else in human life.

**King:** "My kingdom is not of this world" therefore Jesus has the freedom, detachment, love and generosity to lay down his life. These are the characteristics of those who are living the Kingly power of Jesus Christ: freedom, detachment, love and generosity. Only those who can give everything, even their own lives, have the authority of Jesus' kingship.

People who are living fully their baptism consecration are people of great peace, inner strength, freedom and love. These are the people who make our world a better place, they are the people this world most needs. They are found in every walk of life, most never become famous, many live life almost unnoticed but their influence, wisdom and power reaches multitudes, often without even being seen, heard or noticed.

The world needs more of these people, the Church needs them, we cannot become fully alive without them; *let us pray for them today*.
