Church

In our first reading today we find the Church having to deal with a particular problem – must a Christian converted from paganism embrace the practices of Judaism? This is a good question and one that obviously had to come up at some stage in the development of the Church. What may be surprising to us in the 21st Century is that Jesus did not leave instructions in this matter! To think like this is to misunderstand the nature of Church. The Church is not an organisation of people who follow a lifestyle laid down by Jesus or in imitation of how he lived.

The Church is a living body that is constantly evolving, changing and growing and is the living Body of Jesus in our world today. Sometimes the growth is difficult, painful, slow, confusing and even divisive. This particular issue was difficult and painful even for Peter and those who were closest to Jesus. They had to learn that membership of the Church required an ability to change, grow, make decisions and to be guided by the Holy Spirit in ways one would have never chosen or predicted.

In the Acts of the Apostles we see patterns emerging which will form the basis of the Church's decision-making ever since: a new issue or problem arises – the situation is discussed and studied – the people who are directly affected are listened to - the whole Church is *involved* – *the mission and unity of the Church is given priority* – *the* Apostles [and their successors] are asked to decide – the entire Church accepts the decision - the decision leads to new life and growth in the Church, it is seen as a sign of the presence and work of the Holy Spirit.

This may appear a simple and logical process, but looking at the history of the Church we can see how complex and painful it can be – sometimes it has taken centuries for this process to happen! In each era of history, the Church has faced new challenges - while the issues are different, the pain, struggles and confusion keep repeating themselves. Only the conviction that the Holy Spirit was guiding them has got the Church through many struggles down the centuries. This is a conviction that is becoming increasingly difficult to hold onto. There are real and pressing questions today about what membership of Church really means. created using

The crisis in the Church today is not just about some mistakes made or sins committed or ignored [they are symptoms, not causes]. Today we tend to forget or ignore what being a disciple of Jesus means and implies.

I want to conclude with a question: Less than 50 years ago the Church wrote the following: "The joy and hope, the grief and anguish of people of our time, especially of those who are poor or afflicted in any way, are the joy and hope, the grief and anguish of the followers of Christ as well. Nothing that is genuinely human fails to find an echo in their hearts. For theirs is a community composed of people, united in Christ and guided by the Holy Spirit, pressing onwards towards the Kingdom of the Father and are bearers of a message of salvation intended for all people". How many people today really believe this and are prepared to take creative, courageous and prophetic decisions to make it happen?
