Jesus at Nazareth

In today's Gospel we have Jesus in the synagogue of his home village of Nazareth. The congregation is filled with his relatives, friends, neighbours – those whom he played with as a child, those with whom he was educated, those with whom he prayed and worshipped and those for whom he worked as a carpenter. Jesus gets up to read the scriptures and to speak, something he regularly did. We are told "he won the approval of all and they were astonished by the gracious words that came from his lips". Then it all changes: "everyone in the synagogue was enraged, they sprang to their feet and hustled him out of the town...."

What is our reaction to the behaviour of his people; perhaps we might say it is "over the top", excessive, unwarranted, irrational etc. I guess we would be quick to condemn them. Yet this passage challenges us to try to understand and explain their violent treatment of him and their attempt to murder him?

This is the opening of the public ministry of Jesus in Luke's Gospel. Therefore it has particular importance, it is crucial to our understanding of the entire Gospel message. The people gathered in that synagogue are a caricature of the people for whom Luke is writing his Gospel – that is all of us! The people gathered in that synagogue are all of us, we are his family, his disciples, his Church – the people who know him best or think we know him!

The message of Jesus is very attractive, we really like most of what we hear and we want what he promises. However, when we hear anything that is demanding, challenging or threatening to our self-interests or security, we are very quick to reject or ignore what he is saying. Like the people in the synagogue, we are very happy with our lives and our religion just as it is – do not try to change anything or draw our attention to what we are ignoring or avoiding. The story concludes with the author telling us that Jesus "slipped through the crowd and walked away".

Perhaps we could express the message of this story something like this: If you want to control Jesus, manipulate his message or use it for your own self-interest or your own agenda, then there is no need to read any further. If the people closest to Jesus cannot manipulate him or



control him, then you are not going to either. Do not read any further unless you are prepared to be changed by the message you are hearing.

The word of God is being fulfilled today "even as you listen" but it is your choice if you wish to be part of this or not. Just remember one thing, you are not going to stop it. This is the power of God and the work of the Holy Spirit, no human force can get in its way.
