## Lent

Wednesday next is Ash Wednesday – we are beginning the season of Lent. This time each year we are invited to examine who we are and how we are living. Let us remind ourselves of the famous words of Socrates: "An unexamined life is not worth living". Our first reading today from the prophet Jeremiah gives us a very good starting point for our reflections this Lent: "A curse on the man who puts his trust in man, who relies on things of the flesh, whose heart turns from the Lord. He is like dry scrub in the wastelands; if good comes he has no eye for it, he settles in the parched places in the wilderness, a salt land, uninhabited".

Our lives easily drift into wastelands, parched places, uninhabited places – places, circumstances, relationships, habits, lifestyles that are not healthy, life-giving or true to who we really are. As Jeremiah reminds us, we settle in these parched places, our lives become routine, compromised, empty, not what we would really like them to be We need to be woken up, challenged, questioned and reminded of what life could really be, in other words what God wants our lives to be.

In Christian, and particularly Catholic circles, a frequently asked question is: What are you giving up for Lent? Lent is seen as a time for giving up, saying no, denving oneself, etc. This is all good, necessary, and in keeping with the spirit of Lent. However, perhaps we need to ask ourselves why. Perhaps we need to look a little more deeply at why we do these things.

We live in a world that is convinced that the more choice we have, the more freedom we have. Our Biblical and Christian tradition is always telling us that if we want true inner freedom, we need to reduce our external choices. "The more choice we have the less free we become" - it is very difficult to convince people of the truth of this idea! Freedom to choose is not true freedom, freedom [or detachment] from what we are choosing is true freedom. We only arrive at this true, inner, spiritual freedom when we can trust. There is no freedom without trust but all human and earthly trust is flawed, compromised and incomplete. Therefore, only trust in God can give us true freedom. The prophet Jeremiah is not saying that we must not trust other human beings – of created using

course we must, we cannot live without people we can

human being can give us the security and freedom that trust in God can give. Let us listen to a little more from Jeremiah: "A blessing on the man who puts his trust in the Lord, with the Lord as his hope. He is like a tree by the waterside..... he has no worries in the year of drought and never ceases to bear fruit".

Lent is a time to make decisions and choices that are not popular, fashionable or attractive but are made out of trust in God. Lent is a time to break free of external pressures and internal addictions. Lent is the time to discover the real, deep and lasting freedom that comes when we are living lives that are true to ourselves. Without this freedom, sooner or later we "cease to bear fruit" [Jeremiah's image].

Let us pray this Lent that God will give us the grace to see those parts of our lives where we have "ceased to bear fruit" and that we will have the courage, generosity and discipline to break free from this imprisonment and blindness.
