Sunday 20 June 2010 - Twelfth Sunday of the Year

"From Paul, to the Churches of Galatia"

This is the second of four Sundays when we have extracts from *Paul's Letter to the Galatians* as our second Reading. Some people consider this to be the most difficult of Paul's letters; some parts are certainly heavy reading and contain complex arguments from scripture that we may find perplexing.

Galatia, an area of Asia Minor, was made a Roman Province in 25BC, by Augustus. The northern part of this territory was inhabited by the ancient Galatian tribe, traditionally believed to be related to the Celts or Gauls. The Southern part which was added later was of more mixed race, and had a substantial Jewish population. Paul tells us that he is writing to the "Churches of Galatia" but it is not clear which part of Galatia he means, most likely it is the Churches of northern Galatia which are primarily Gentile in origin. Paul tells his readers that he is writing this letter because "certain troublemakers among you want to change the Good News of Christ". We don't know who these people are but they are teaching that Paul is not an authentic Apostle because he did not know Jesus personally and so did not get his authority from Jesus. They accuse him of neglecting the Law of Moses and of using the Gospel as a way of watering down the demands of the Law.

Paul is very angry when he writes this letter. He writes a very strong defence of himself and the Gospel he has preached: "Let me warn you that if anyone preaches a version of the Good News different from the one we have already preached to you, whether it be ourselves or an angel from heaven, he is to be condemned". We must be grateful to "these troublemakers" because as a result we have a letter that tells us so much about Paul; his personal story, his character and his understanding of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

In today's extract Paul is emphasising that it is only Jesus Christ that matters. Those who are baptised "are all one in Jesus Christ". They are the true heirs of Abraham, it is faith in Jesus that makes one a true heir of Abraham and not the practice of the laws and rituals of Judaism.

It is interesting [and challenging for us!] that Paul expects all Christians, both Jew and Gentile, to follow and understand complex and subtle arguments from scripture. By baptism we are all children of God through faith in Christ Jesus. This sets us free from sinfulness and from external customs and rituals that were given an over-emphasis by certain factions who were influencing the Churches of Galatia. Paul's argument is subtle and requires careful reading, he is not rejecting the scriptures or Judaism but only certain rituals and practices and an over-rigid interpretation of the law.

A true and authentic understanding and interpretation of the scriptures is necessary for us to come to know the depth and breadth of the message of Jesus Christ. Paul wants this for the Christians of Galatia and he expresses his wish with passion, force and deep love.

Take some time to read this letter, you will find it a very worthwhile experience!
