Think - Like a Christian

Our second reading today is the conclusion of *St Paul's Letter to the Galatians*. Paul did not write his letters himself, rather he dictated them to his assistants or secretaries. However, he usually concludes his letters with some words of greeting, and a summary of his principal message, in his own handwriting. The personal message at the end of this letter is his strongest and most passionate and we hear the essence of it at Mass today. Note how he begins the message: "*Take good note of what I am adding in my own handwriting and in large letters*". We can be in no doubt that he considers what he is saying today to be very important. This letter is written as a response to particular problems in the Church in Galatia – we do not know what these problems are. Does his response have relevance to us today and particularly what might it be saying to us about how to deal with our problems of crisis? I would like to pick out three ideas from Paul's response:

- 1. The Cross of Our Lord Jesus Christ: This is where every Christian goes in time of crisis, pain and confusion. The death of Jesus on the cross has changed everything how we know God, how we see the world, how we view our pain and problems, how we relate with each other and how we view ourselves. Jesus died on the cross to save us and so every crisis and challenge must be viewed by the Christian from this perspective.
- **2. New Creature** or **New Creation:** This is a favourite theme in a number of Paul's letters. It gives us an insight into how he understands Christianity and sees its importance. Through baptism the Christian becomes a "New Creature" and is living in this "New Creation".
- **3. Israel of God:** This is a very interesting phrase. Belonging to God's chosen people is no longer about race, culture, religion, laws or traditions but about union with Jesus who died on the cross and the grace of baptism which makes us new creatures.

These three ideas are all about change in outlook or thinking. They make the conflicts and worries of everyday life seem trivial and those who partake in them small-minded and self-centred. Paul is frustrated and angry that the new Christians of Galatia are still so far away from the thinking and outlook that should be expected of those reborn in Jesus Christ. Can the same criticism be made of us Christians of the 21st Century???
