Sunday 13 December 2009 – Third Sunday of Advent (Gaudete Sunday)

John the Baptist

One of the great difficulties we face each Advent is to understand the preaching of John the Baptist and why he is so important in the overall context of the Christian message. Reading the Gospels, we are left in no doubt about the importance of John and his preaching. Yet at the same time his preaching can seem unattractive and incomprehensible and, perhaps more importantly, quite different in both style and content from the preaching of Jesus which immediately follows.

John the Baptist describes Jesus to the people in these words: "He will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and with fire". What might these words mean? Perhaps we think we know who the Holy Spirit is – at least we know his presence is welcome, good and life-giving. Fire, we are not so sure about – the next line would appear to indicate that fire is a threat. However, in the "Acts of the Apostles" the Holy Spirit will come down upon the disciples in tongues of fire.

We have an expression in the English language: a baptism of fire.

An example of its use would be if one begins a new job and all the problems are landed on one's desk immediately with no gentle easing in or "honeymoon" period. Perhaps this gives us an idea of the spirit of John the Baptist's preaching – the coming of Jesus is a "baptism of fire" in the new way of living which will come to be known as <u>Christian living</u>. There can be no hesitation, compromise or delay in the way we welcome and embrace this new way of living. Change must happen and must happen immediately. A little earlier in today's Gospel, John has shown us that there is no escaping this change, everyone must change. We all have our wrong ways of seeing things, doing things, and decision making. We are all lacking in charity and imprisoned by self-interest. All that varies is our way of living and expressing our distorted ways of thinking and being.

Change is necessary and urgent, it must always begin in <u>my</u> heart, <u>my</u> life, <u>my</u> relationships, <u>my</u> priorities etc. We are all experts at evading this reality and this imperative. John has to use shock tactics, strong language and the force and power of his personality to get his message across. John differs from Jesus in style and personality but the content of his message is



very similar to Jesus. John not only understands the message of Jesus but he also knows and understands the impact and implications of the message of Jesus. John not only reminds us in very strong and vivid language about the message of Jesus, he also sets before us the implications and urgency of this message.

I guess if we really heard the message of Jesus and saw its implications with the clarity of John, then we also would be acting and speaking as John does. A person who has been "baptised with the Holy Spirit and fire" cannot remain lukewarm or indifferent. The baptism of Jesus calls for a whole new way of living, thinking and relating and this new way of life must begin now.
