### Lent and Baptism

Lent is the season of preparation for baptism, and those already baptised are invited to prepare for the renewal of baptism at Easter. Baptism is the most positive and life-giving step any person can take in their lives. However, before a person is baptised [and before we renew our baptism promises] three questions are asked which are negative in their nature. In other words, in order to say “yes” to baptism, we must say “no” to something. I would like to reflect on these three questions today.

**Do you reject Satan?** Some people are uncomfortable with the idea of personifying evil, let’s leave that issue aside and reflect on what it means when we speak about rejecting Satan. Evil is more than what a human being does or some bad influence, it is first and foremost a distorted and destructive relationship in one’s life. We are formed, influenced and beholden to those with whom we are in relationship.

Evil becomes something [or someone] that shapes and influences us and to which we owe a loyalty. It can be very difficult and painful to break off that loyalty because it is so deep within us, it is part of who we are.

**And all his works?** This is not about rejecting something that someone else [or something else] does. It is I who do the works I am rejecting. However, they are works that do not properly belong to me. Conversion is about discovering one’s true self and when one does this, then one rejects what is not true to one’s true self.

**And all his empty promises?** So much of life is chasing after empty promises. If only I had this, achieved that, arrived there etc. I would then be happy!! The greatest emptiness in life is to have all one ever longed for and not have peace or happiness. It is our distorted way of thinking and acting that leads us to place our trust in promises that are in truth empty. Our desires, longings and ambitions need to be purified. We need to learn how to desire what is healthy, life-giving and truthful.

Our answer to each of these questions is **I do.** Everything I do from that moment onwards, for the rest of my life, is my response to these questions. I must constantly return to these questions and examine the quality of my response

A fruitful way of looking at this season of Lent is to ask myself the question: What must I say “**No**” to in order that my response to the call of Jesus in my life will be more healthy, generous, truthful and complete?

These three questions must be taken seriously and returned to frequently throughout the journey of life, otherwise baptism is guaranteed to disappoint. Without a serious and committed response to these questions, baptism remains at the “expectation” level - that is, it remains another commodity, achievement or instrument that is at my service and expected to give me happiness or peace or strength or whatever my expectation may be. It is my response to these three questions that creates the space for God’s grace to come flooding into my life. When this happens, **Baptism** becomes what it is meant to be: **New Life** - nothing less.
