Sunday 3 June 2012 – Most Holy Trinity

Trinity Sunday

Today the Church recalls the heartbeat of Christian faith – that Father, Son and Holy Spirit is the name of God we trust and believe to be with us in our journey through life. It is the unique name we as Christians address to God, only knowable because Jesus revealed his way of relating to God. He addressed God as Father, indicating to those with faith the possibility of perceiving him as Son of God. He also revealed that an "Advocate" (Holy Spirit) would continue to be involved with our faith journey. Jesus revealed his relationship with God to secure that the unique relationship enjoyed by Him could be enjoyed by us – though in a different way. This different way to my mind could be called "indwelling". Though we are not the Incarnate Word (God become flesh), we have been gifted with the unique manner by which God (Father, Son and Holy Spirit) communicates. Jesus revealed the gifted capacity in us to relate to the love being expressed by the Father, Son and Holy Spirit when he prised open the door of prayer that was different. "Our Father" is how he taught us to pray. The Lord's Prayer helps us access this indwelling exchange taking place within us. Don't take my word for this either:

It is there, right in the depths, in the Heaven of my soul, that I love to find Him since He never leaves me, "God in me, I in Him", oh! That is my life..... Elizabeth of the Trinity. (Carmelite Nun).

The key for Elizabeth is her awareness that within us God dwells and continues to converse, to exchange love – to live love. It is true that "love makes the world go round" in the sense that God's love sustains, keeps things in being – and with us even the cessation of life here is not ended but enters life eternal. That life begins the moment we are conceived. Something that Elizabeth perceived at such a young age and which naturally led her to sense the calling to reveal to us the indwelling nature of God. It is no wonder she would go on to say:-

"Let us live with God as with a friend, let us make our faith a living faith in order to be in communion with Him through everything, for that is what makes saints. We possess our heaven within us, since He who satisfies the hunger of the glorified in the light of vision – gives Himself to us in faith and mystery, it is the Same one!"

Her image of the Trinity teaches us to appreciate that God entrusts himself to us and does not want His Presence to remain a secret. She let prayer draw her into the conversation taking place within and touched the Presence needed to live an authentic Christian life, if only to become another Christ to others to keep awareness that God entrusts himself to us.
