A View for the Pew

Homer Simpson, in one episode of *The Simpsons*, is taking a stroll through the clouds with God. In the conversation he asks God what is the meaning of life? God responds "Oh, come on Homer, I cannot answer that. You'll find out when you die". Simple Homer responds "I cannot wait that long! God says "You cannot wait six months?" "No" responds the everso-simple Homer, oblivious to the revelation! The scene ends with the two of them setting off into the horizon as God opens up and begins to reveal his answer to Homer – but we do not get to hear this secret!

Whatever you may think of this satirical cartoon – which seems to question institutions – the Church included, this episode is interesting to stay with and reflect upon. In a certain sense we understand God's response to Homer about withholding the meaning of life. But in another sense it does not sit right on our shoulders as Christians. This is because the God we believe in is one who *Reveals*. As the catechism reminds us:

"By his Revelation, "the invisible God, from the fullness of his love, addresses men as friends, and moves among them, in order to invite and receive them into his own company. The adequate response to this invitation is faith..." (142).

Contrary to Homer's God then, the Christian faith helps us understand that God wants us to know him and live with him in this life; to believe and trust in his revelation-plan. We do not have to wait till we die to find this out, nor to become involved with his friendship. In the Christian God there is no secrecy about our journey, nor our journey's end. No. There is only depth to charge life with meaning. If there is a secret sensed about God, maybe it is only a depth waiting to be discovered afresh by a simple act of faith. After all, it is not about understanding seeking faith, but faith seeking understanding that describes a Christian's journey, right?

II Bicentenary of Franz Liszt II

1811-1886

This year is the **Bicentenary of the birth of Pianist & Composer, Franz Liszt**, born in Hungary on 22 October 1811. He was a close friend and music teacher of **Fr Hermann Cohen**, founder of our Carmelite Church. Born in Hamburg in 1820, son of a Jewish banker, Hermann's great musical talent was evident from an early age and when he was 12 years old he began piano lessons with Liszt. This led to a successful musical career as a pianist. However, at the age of 26 Hermann experienced a moment of 'revelation' and was baptised a Christian, and three years later was ordained a Priest in the Carmelite Order.

To commemorate the **Bicentenary of Franz Liszt**, we are pleased to announce that on **Sunday next 23 October** our 11 o'clock Latin Choir, conducted by Bruce Ogston, will sing the **Mass composed by Franz Liszt** – **Missa Choralis**. All are invited.
