**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE
CEMETERY AND ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE**

HELD AT CWMLLYNFELL CEMETERY ON MONDAY 26th OCTOBER AT 10.00AM.

84. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies for their absence were received from Councillors R M Davies, R Evans, D Lloyd, R P Morgan and S Williams. Councillor K Lloyd, Neath Port Talbot County Borough Council had also tendered her apologies.

85. MEMORIAL KERB STONES

The Committee considered the proposal to permit memorial kerb stones to be installed alongside the roadway at the cemetery by bereaved families that may wish to take advantage of such a facility.

It was reported that the Gwrhyd Quarry was able to supply blue pennant stones that had been cut, dressed and inscribed. Separate arrangements would have to be made for the installation of the kerb stones.

The Committee viewed the locations that would be suitable for the installation of the kerb stones and concluded that the best location would be at the section of road way immediately to the left of the entrance gateway.

Recommended that:

1. the installation of memorial kerb stones at the cemetery as described above be permitted;
2. a suitable specification for the installation of the kerb stones be prepared with a view to inviting quotations from appropriate contractors.

86. WILDFLOWER MEADOW

The Committee viewed the undeveloped area of the cemetery and considered the potential of taking advantage of the free "Grow Wild" seed kits operated by the Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew and the Groundwork Green Space Project.

Recommended that a registration be made on behalf of the Council for the free Grow Wild seed kit and enquiries be also made of Groundwork with regard to the possibility of taking advantage of their Green Space Project.

The meeting terminated at 10.40a.m.
