Structure Governance & Management

Constitution

The charity is an unincorporated association. It is governed by its constitution which was adopted on 06 March 2012. The association was granted charitable status by OSCR on 29 November 2012

Appointment of Trustees

In accordance with the constitution the management committee is made up of trustees and there must be a minimum of 4 elected trustees to take up the roles of Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary and Treasurer. The committee may co-opt further trustees if they consider it to be in the interest of the association. The management committee were elected at the AGM held on **26 September 2018** at the Community Hall.

A communication is sent to all residents approx. three weeks before the AGM to ask if any residents would like to become Trustees and / or be considered for election for one of the committee roles.

Changes to Trustees

Gregory Cox has stepped down as Vice Chair – (26 09 18) Edwin Dick has been elected as Vice Chair - (26 09 18)

Management

The trustees are responsible for the running of the association and managing the community facility. The day to day running of the association is carried out on a voluntary basis by the committee.

Objectives and Activities

Charitable Purposes

The provision of recreational facilities, or the organisation of recreational facilities, with the object of improving the conditions of life for the persons for whom the facilities or activities are primarily intended

Activities

Our activities are primarily based around retaining a community facility for the benefit of all residents and visitors to Egilsay. This includes

- Repairs, maintenance and decoration of the community building
- Liaising with Orkney Islands Council for repairs to the fabric of the building and the main utilities which remain the responsibility of Orkney Islands Council
- Taking responsibility for the community turbine its maintenance and repair and managing the revenue created through the FITs payment scheme
- Provision of equipment for the purpose of leisure and recreational activities
- Holding community social events
- Assisting residents to access health, education and recreational activities on our neighbouring islands and on Orkney mainland e.g. provision of ferry tickets for sports / theatre/pantomime / well being courses/Seasonal events/music/training courses that cannot be provided on the island.
- Partnership working with other organisations to arrange events and enhance facilities on Egilsay
- Ensuring appropriate insurance and licences are in place.
- Holding committee meetings as appropriate and the AGM

Achievements and Performance

- 1. Travel assistance for permanent residents helping with ferry/bus/taxi fares to attend facilities outwith Egilsay.
- 2. Each household with permanent residents were allocated £200 to assist with cost of travel.
- 3. Egilsay Community produced leaflets that advertise the community facility to locals and visitors alike these are placed on the boat the Tingwall waiting room, Travel Centre Kirkwall and various outlets on Rousay.
- 4. We have seen a significant increase in tourists this year and there are many positive and appreciative comments entered into our visitors book – the increase has been largely to do with events surrounding MAGNUS 900 with a group of 13 pilgrims on 13th July and a group of 70 from the Catholic Diocese of Aberdeen on 29th July as well as the overall increase in tourists to Orkney
- 5. We continue to work in partnership with the RSPB who continue to maintain a significant presence on the island and have had several organised groups visit this year who have been welcomed to our community facility.

- 6. Work continues at Onziebust and RSPB activity has significantly increased usage of the ferry service.
- 7. The Orkney Storytelling festival held an event in the community hall on 28th October which was well attended by visitors and residents alike
- 8. UHI Archaeology Dept held a Mapping St Magnus event on 14th November and used the community facility for lunch

The community facility is used for events and functions, committee meetings and the AGM as well as hires to RSPB and other visiting groups. We have welcomed numerous independent walkers and several repeat visitors. We have facilitated several MAGNUS 900 events and the table below summaries the main events that have taken place 01 June 2017 to 31 May 2018

Community Facilities

Community Turbine

Since the major repairs that were completed in May 2017 the turbine has been up and running with no identifiable issues we are currently waiting for our annual maintenance check (2018) to be scheduled in.

Hire Rates for the Hall

The Main Hall (groups up to approx. 40 people) £25 per hour The Classroom (groups up to approx 12 people) £15 per hour The Main Hall and Classroom together £30 per hour

Water

We were served with a Boil Notice after water sampling by OIC Environmental services. ECA bought in bottled water for use by anyone using the hall. Discussions with OIC the landlord of the property resulted in further tests and replacement parts and UV filters at their expense. The water is now safe to drink and boil notice removed.

Repairs

It was agreed that the external step and threshold from the main building to the outside shed should be replaced and the rotten sills replaced on both sheds, the metal railings on the disabled access ramp repainted and the picnic benches sealed with external preservative. It was agreed that the work should be undertaken locally and completed before the summer dance in July. (Materials shown in accounts 01 June 2017 – 31 May 2018) (Labour shown in accounts 01 June 2018 – 21 May 2019)

Cleaning

It was agreed that due to regular use and increasing numbers of visitors £40 per calendar month of 30 days or less and £50 for calendar months with 31 days should be offered on a self-employed basis to a member of the community (Accounts 01 June 2018 – 31 May 2019) This would ensure regular checks, early reporting of any maintenance, replenishment of stocks and cleaning.

Toilet Facilities

The number of large groups experienced over the last couple of years highlighted the need for the old school toilets at the back of the building to be refurbished. They are functional with a cold water supply but the sanitary ware needs replacing and the outbuildings need to be made weathertight and re-decorated.

Hall Floor

It has been agreed that the hall floor should be renovated, quotes have been received and a contractor appointed. This is expected to cost in the region of £3000 the work will take place during October 2018 (the hall will remain closed for October) and the invoice will show in the accounts for 01 Jun 2018 to 31 May 2019

Financial Review

Payments to individuals (including charity trustees and connected persons)

As part of our application to become a charity we informed OSCR that ECA intended to pay nominal amounts to inhabitants of Egilsay for work undertaken at the community facility on the Associations behalf. A population of 20, living on a very small remote island, by definition everyone is connected.

It was agreed at the AGM 17 July 2012 that to complement the voluntary work already undertaken nominal payments for small jobs was acceptable on the following grounds. Work is undertaken on behalf of the community and for which the association is responsible. E.g. grass cutting, Decorating and maintenance, cleaning, book-keeping/accounts and ad-hoc requirements decided by the committee.

It was agreed that it was important to get work done by the community for the community avoiding the high costs of importing labour from mainland Orkney

All monies paid will be invoiced and recorded in the Egilsay Community Association accounts. Paid work will be minuted and a summary presented at each AGM

All jobs are considered to be of equal importance and a standard rate of £10 an hour applies

This is carried out by the treasurer and submitted to the approved accountant Davie Campbell for inspection before presenting at the AGM

EXPENDITURE

Restricted funds -

The remaining £282 of Your Islands Your choice funding was spent on Magnus 900 promotional material, Logo, rack cards, posters and advertising

All of the funds under this grant have now been spent and the project has ended.

Community Council grant of £300 was awarded for annual community fireworks and £1000 to help with the significant costs associated with Turbine repairs in 2017.

Unrestricted funds

The committee decided to continue with the issue of books of 50 passenger tickets (at 50% discount) for all permanent residents on Egilsay enabling our community to enjoy recreational and well-being activities not available on Egilsay without incurring the cost of travel. **This totalled £1614.15**

General expenditure in this financial year has been attributed to the running of the facility including telephone and broadband payments £679.64 renewal of TV licence £152.00 public liability £286.02 (end of monthly contract with Highland Council) + £395.01 (annual payment to Zurich) - grass cutting £210 - book keeping, preparation of accounts and Trustees Annual Report £210 - Website and domain £69.14 - McAffee virus protection £90.00 - Haulage £24 - Materials for maintenance and repairs £371.53

Sundry consumable items such as printer ink and paper and bottled water, tea, coffee, milk, biscuits, and providing refreshments for several large groups of visitors made up the remainder of expenditure. £690.38

Expenditure TOTAL £5091.87

INCOME

Revenue from our main source of funding, the community 6kw wind Turbine realised £6658.17 The Community council paid £1000 towards turbine repairs and a further £300 awarded for Bonfire and Fireworks night Other income was made up donations from visitors to the hall of £452,45 for consumables. A credit of £86.40 was made against a refund on an invoice

Reserves

The trustees policy is to retain sufficient funds to cover its leasehold responsibilities to Orkney Islands Council such as ad hoc maintenance, internal repairs and decoration and on going liabilities such as turbine maintenance, insurance, licences, telephone and broadband and the annual fee for the Orkney Communities website and independent examination of accounts. The trustees also wish to retain sufficient funds to repair or replace equipment owned by the association. Around £5000 held as a reserve is thought to be a realistic amount to cover this.

Plans for future periods

The trustees plan to maintain and develop the facility for the benefit of the community and will actively seek suggestions for the next stage in revitalising and rejuvenating our community facility. The wooden floor in the hall is being refurbished during October 2018 and we hope to progress with

expressed an interest in selling the School/community hall building with the school house. Communications and negotiations are underway with OIC and we are waiting for a formal proposal of options from Orkney Islands Council.

St Magnus Way - Rousay, Egilsay & Wyre Development Trust (REWDT) have funded Way markers, stone sculpture and information boards. The way markers have been installed and the information boards and stone sculptures will be installed soon. Being included as an integral part of the St Magnus Way on mainland Orkney will increase visitors, encourage walkers who have an interest in St Magnus and provide a legacy for the future.

Partnership working - We plan to develop partnership working with Rousay School, RSPB, The Rousa, Egilsay & Wyre Heritage Trust, REWDT, St Magnus Way, OIC and other interested parties with a view to promoting Egilsay as a place to visit and facilitating various events for visiting groups.

Independent Examiners Report

Independent Examiners report to the Trustees of Egilsay Community Association

I report on the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 May 2018 which are set out on the following pages 8-12 inclusive.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner

The Charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the terms of the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005.
